



He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Mathematics and a Bachelor of Science degree in Physics in 1987 from the University of Chicago. In 1995, the University of Chicago's Department of Astronomy and Astrophysics conferred a Ph.D. degree on Father Kartje. In addition, he earned a Doctorate in Sacred Theology from the Catholic University of America's Department of Biblical Studies in 2010.

Sunday November 26, 2023 Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

We have come to the end of another liturgical year. Before we jump too far into the freshness of Advent, let us pause and take stock of this past year of Christian living. Where did we encounter Christ? When did we act as Christ for another? In what ways did we succeed—and fall short—in answering the Christian call? Today's gospel reminds us of our core Christian practices: feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, caring for the sick, and visiting the imprisoned. Each of these actions makes the love of Christ known in the world. As we reflect back on the past year, may God draw our awareness to the people and places that benefited from our Christian practices and the areas in which we can grow in the year ahead.

When we envision royalty, we think of glamour and adventure, of triumph and power. Kings and queens are people set apart, people greater than others. In this gospel, Jesus offers us a radically different image. He comes in glory and power, yes, but underlying this is a radical solidarity with the least ones of his kingdom. Christ's power is used to encourage just and compassionate treatment of those we are all too quick to overlook: people who are poor, unfamiliar, and imprisoned. His power lies not primarily in shaming and banishing those who do not obey this command, but in his deep identification with those in need. We would probably claim that we would treat Jesus with the utmost respect, deserving of his unique place in the cosmic kingdom. Here he tells us, though, that we have opportunities to do so all the time. How we treat the least ones we encounter is how we treat Christ, our King.

Today's gospel paints a vivid picture of the end times. Over the past few weeks, we have heard Jesus preach about the ways we are to live as we await the coming of God's kingdom. Matthew leaves little to the imagination in this final scene. When the Son of Man comes in glory, we will be judged by how we treated the poor and the marginalized Christ in our midst. Caring for our neighbors in need is challenging work. How easy it is to walk by the person asking for grocery money or to keep at arm's length the immigrant family new to town. Yet easy is not the Christian way. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we can do the hard work of loving our neighbors. Source: Living Liturgy, Liturgical Press

Family Connection to the Gospel


In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches us that we will be judged on only one thing: the acts of mercy we have shown to the least among us. Jesus identifies with the least ones; thus we serve Jesus whenever we serve one of the least ones. The Church calls the actions that Jesus described in today's Gospel the Corporal Works of Mercy. These works are to feed the hungry, to clothe the naked, to bury the dead, to shelter the homeless, to visit the sick and imprisoned, and to give alms to the poor. In these actions we show God's compassion and mercy to those in need.

As you gather as a family, recall the list of the Corporal Works of Mercy. Talk about some concrete examples of how your family might do these actions in your community and then discuss why it is important that we do these things. Read Matthew 25:31-46. Ask: Why does Jesus say we ought to do these works of mercy? (Because whenever we show mercy to another person, we show mercy to Jesus himself.) Choose one Corporal Work of Mercy that your family will act upon this week. Pray together that your family will see and serve Jesus in the least ones among us. Pray the Lord's Prayer or an Act of Love.

Act of Love Prayer

O my God, I love you above all things with my whole heart and soul, because you are all good and worthy of all my love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of you. I forgive all who have injured me and I ask pardon of those whom I have injured. Amen.

If Jesus was to return tomorrow to separate the sheep from the goats, in which group would you be? How effective have you been in living the Beatitudes? If we're candid with ourselves when answering those questions, we recognize we may be on somewhat shaky ground. By working together to become more effective disciples of

Jesus, we can help each other better answer those questions.

We've been discussing for some weeks now how to become more intentional in our discipleship. Sherry Weddell in her book *Forming Intentional Disciples* has some interesting comments on discerning the charisms or gifts we each have received from the Holy Spirit. She notes it is critical to understand that charisms are given to all the baptized and not to a few extraordinary Christians.

We all need to be open to those gifts and utilize them. The charism of hospitality empowers us to be a generous channel of God's love by warmly welcoming and caring for those needing friendship (i.e. greeters). It also may extend to caring for those in need of food and shelter (i.e. St. Vincent DePaul Society).

The charism of mercy empowers us to be channels of God's love through practical deeds of compassion (i.e. minister to the sick or homebound). Charisms of evangelization or teaching may lead to volunteering to help with Religious Education, the OCIA program, or simply by no longer being afraid of discussing faith with others when the opportunity arises. The charism of intercessory prayer empowers the intense prayer of a Christian for others to be the means by which God's love and deliverance reaches those in need so we may grow in trusting God more (i.e. prayer and worship groups).

Intentional disciples need to change expectations. Catholics often don't expect to see God at work in others and in themselves. Weddell writes, "If we are going to seriously evangelize our own, we

Today we come to the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year as we celebrate Jesus Christ, The King of the Universe.

In the world's view of royalty we may think of a person set apart, being nobler than others, being separated from others. This sense of nobleness can give a sense of being aloof or in some cases as not caring. The separation by physical distance is for some good reasons such as security from those who may want to harm them, but can also be seen as a disconnection from the everyday lives of others.

Our King, Jesus Christ accepts all of us where we are and wants to have a relationship with all. Nothing of this world can separate us from the love of and relationship with Jesus. The only way not to encounter Him is to intentionally avoid Him. The incarnation of Christ enables us to relate to our God in all aspects of life because we walked the same life paths that we walk.

In today's gospel, we are told how we will be judged, how to be welcomed into eternal life, the life that is waiting for all of God's people. How we respond to the needs of others, do we act in the same manner as Jesus did when he was physically among the people of his time on earth?

At first glance this seems very doable, but when faced with the actual situation sometimes we turn away from doing as this passage states. This is usually caused by the uncertainty of our own ability to really be of assistance. In these moments, does our trust in God to give us the words or courage to be his presence to another. Relying on the Presence of our King who promised never to leave us can and will lead us to the eternal life he offers.

Being conscious of the needs of others and respecting their dignity as sons and daughters of God that we all hold in common can bring us to hearing those words of Jesus, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world." 

Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.
