

CONFIRMATION





During the weeks leading up to Confirmation, we have been publishing letters to the parishioners in the bulletin from the eighth grade students in St. Philip the Apostle School and the Religious Education Program. In these letters, the students introduce themselves and their families and explain why they want to be Confirmed and what

they plan to do after Confirmation as adult members of the church. Below is our final letter in this series from Francesca Rohlfing, a St. Philip the Apostle School student.

Dear St. Philip the Apostle Parish,

All my life I have been taught that I am Catholic, a follower of Christ. I was raised to believe in God and that He is my Almighty Father. Now, however, it is my turn to decipher how I truly feel about God and whether or not I am ready to fully become a disciple of Christ. Will I devote the rest of my life to God and recognize Him as my true Father? The answer is yes. Yes, I will be Confirmed and begin my journey as a practicing Catholic. Yes, I will always serve God and those around me, continuously following Him.

My name is Francesca Rohlfing. After years of studying and practicing Catholicism, I feel that I am ready to take on the task of being anointed by the Holy Spirit. I will do as I am called and follow in Jesus' footsteps. My family has always taught me that I must choose to do the right thing, even in difficult situations. They are the reason I am ready to be Confirmed and have always supported me in everything I do. My grandfather also endlessly encourages and cares for me, one of the many reasons why I chose him to be my sponsor. He has never doubted me and has always stuck by my side. I can count on him and trust him to always be there for me. There is not a single memory I have that does not include him being my biggest supporter.

I have chosen the Confirmation name Faustina because the saint, Faustina Kowalska, has always stood out to me. She never cared about what others thought of her, but continue to follow God throughout her life. People would judge her for her impoverished background and appearance. Many also deemed her to be insane after she began seeing images of Christ. Sometimes, I feel that I care too much about what others might think of me, therefore affecting the outcomes of my actions. I want to be like St. Faustina, where the only person I care about impressing is God. I believe that part of having faith in God is becoming careless of what others think and do. It means following Him because you want to, not because others may or may not want you to.

After I am Confirmed, I will continue to follow God and live my life more fully as a Catholic. I will continue to go to Mass weekly and honor Him on the Sabbath, along with participating in Church more. One way to do this is to simply sing the psalms along with the choir, professing my faith and love for God. I will worship God regularly and pray daily. I will believe in and practice what Jesus has taught me. I will continue to serve those in need. So far, I have donated to many charities and written letters to children dealing with afflictions who are in hospitals. These experiences have taught me to think less about myself and more about the wants and needs of God's children.

There are many reasons why I want to be Confirmed. I am a substantial believer in Christ and wish to grow closer to Him in any way possible. I want to be a disciple and follower of God, no matter my situation. When I am Confirmed, my bond with Him will be strengthened. He has gifted me with many amazing talents and abilities. I thank Him every day for everything He has done for us, including sacrificing His only son. I know that God will always accept me and love me, even though I am not perfect. He will always be with me and care for me, despite my many sins. God is my Father Almighty and cares for me eminently.



Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.
