

JOIN THE DIOCESAN MISSION TRIP TO THE NAVAJO NATION IN JUNE

The Diocese of Joliet is pleased to announce its U.S. mission program in June with a two-week trip to the Navajo Nation located near Chinle, Arizona. The June 3-16 trip will focus on construction projects for residents of the reservation, with volunteers helping with such jobs as framing a house, tearing down dilapidated buildings, repairing fencing, etc. "It's not just going to work for the people, but to be with them and experience their life and culture," said diocesan missions coordinator Bruce Carlson. The diocese has organized mission trips to the reservation since 2002, but paused the annual expeditions during 2020 and 2021 because of the Coronavirus pandemic. The trip resumed this past summer. Interested individuals are invited to attend an informational meeting at 7:00 p.m. on January 10 or January 18 at the Blanchette Catholic Center, 16555 Weber Road in Crest Hill, IL. Dear Friends,

Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. This national collection supports many pastoral projects that benefit the faithful in Latin America and the Caribbean. An example of a beneficiary of this collection are the priests in the Diocese of Guantánamo-Baracoa, who traverse bad roads over rough terrain to bring the sacraments and the Word of God to the faithful living there. The mountainous territory that makes up 75% of the diocese's total land area makes travel not only difficult but also more expensive for priests due to higher fuel consumption, vehicle maintenance, and repair costs compared to other regions.

Catholics like you who generously contribute to the Collection for the Church in Latin America help Guantánamo-Baracoa's priests stay on the road with funds given to the diocese to offset fuel and vehicle repair costs. In places such as Cuba, you help bring the Good News to the poor when you participate in the collection.

An important fact that you must know is that 25% of this diocesan collection goes to support our own diocesan mission work. Since 1994 our diocese has sent missionaries to Sucre, Bolivia, to not only offer our support with concrete actions, but to build relationships with the people who are so grateful for our presence and work there. We are blessed to have our Bolivian friends.

Let us all become missionaries by strengthening the Church in Latin America with a donation to the second collection on the weekend of January 21-22.

Bishop Hicks' Column

January 2023: Peace be with you



Recently, while visiting a parish, I noticed a “peace pole” on the property, surrounded by beautiful landscaping and benches. The pole had four sides, with each side displaying an inscription about peace. The expressions of peace moved from the general to the specific:

Peace on Earth
Peace for our Nation
Peace within our Church
Peace in our Hearts

As I contemplated that simple yet beautiful peace pole, I realized that peace is something we all long for, and yet can seem so unattainable. St. Augustine captured the unreachable nature of peace when he said, “Our hearts are restless until they rest in you, O Lord.” Even though peace may be elusive, we know the source of true peace. It is therefore with great faith and hope that we as a Church never stop seeking it through Mary, the Queen of Peace, and her son, Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

As we begin 2023, we remember that St. Paul VI in 1967 established the World Day of Peace to be celebrated on January 1, which is also the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. In 1972, Pope Paul VI coined his famous phrase, “If you want peace, work for justice.”

Popes since then have carried on this tradition of issuing messages of peace on this day, with their communications usually associated with the social doctrine of the Church. Hence, popes have made declarations on January 1 regarding the United Nations, human rights, the right to life, economic development, international diplomacy, wars, peace in the Holy Land, globalization, terrorism, etc.

For 2023, Pope Francis writes about our current global condition, as we cope with the long-term effects of the coronavirus pandemic and the impact of the war in Ukraine. He stresses the need for an all-inclusive approach to peace: “We can no longer think exclusively of carving out space for our personal or national interests; instead, we must think in terms of the common good, recognizing that we belong to a greater

community, and opening our minds and hearts to universal human fraternity. We cannot continue to focus simply on preserving ourselves; rather, the time has come for all of us to endeavour to heal our society and our planet, to lay the foundations for a more just and peaceful world, and to commit ourselves seriously to pursuing a good that is truly common.”

Peace is not just something that we should all work for; it is also something we should constantly be praying for. The next time you are at Mass, I invite you to listen to just how many times the word “peace” is used. Specifically in the Communion rite, immediately after the “Our Father,” the priest prays that the peace of Christ will fill our hearts, our families, our Church, our communities, and our world as we extend a sign of peace to those around us. These prayers explicitly follow Jesus’ message throughout the Gospels, “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.” (John 14: 27)

As we begin this new year, I urge you to pray for peace every Sunday when you attend Mass, and to also try to do so daily. If we get into the habit of praying for peace each day, it becomes even more important to disconnect from the noise and busyness of our world and intentionally to find a “peaceful” place to reflect and contemplate.

During this initial year of the National Eucharistic Revival, I encourage you to take some time before the eucharistic Lord in adoration. It is a beautiful and powerful way to connect our minds, hearts and souls to the peace of Christ. Another possibility is to find a consistent, quiet spot in your home or a sacred space to sit, be still and pray. It is in these serene moments that the Holy Spirit may gently whisper into our ears the ways that God may want us to be an instrument of peace.

As a people of peace, let’s begin this new year by praying for and working for peace on Earth, peace for our nation, peace within our Church, peace in our hearts and wherever it is needed most. For ultimately, at the very end of every Catholic Mass throughout the world, we are mandated to “go in peace.” And to that, we boldly affirm by responding, “Thanks be to God!”

As part of their preparations for being Confirmed, the eighth graders from the school and the Religious Education Program wrote letters to the parishioners explaining why they want to be Confirmed and what they plan to do after Confirmation. The letter below is from Antonella Pontrelli, a student from St. Philip the Apostle School.

Dear St. Philip the Apostle Parish,

I am Antonella Pontrelli. My faith is important to me because it is what God wants me to do. I would like to be Confirmed because I want to come closer to God. I would like to strengthen my relationship with Jesus. I want to become an adult Catholic. I feel I am ready now because I am old enough to truly understand my faith. Now, I also know how big a role God plays in my life. I depend on God when I don't know the outcome of a situation. I pray to Him to help me. I will try to pray more and go to church more often once I am Confirmed. I want to be a follower of Jesus.

From my service experience in preschool, I have learned many things. I originally thought that it was easy to care for younger children. Now I have learned that it is not as easy as I thought. It is hard to care for one preschooler and even harder to care for a whole class. The preschoolers need help with many things, including opening plastic bags, making sculptures out of playdoh, and tying shoes.

I chose St. Bernadette for my Confirmation name because I really liked her story. I admire her humbleness in the situation that she was in. I had come across her name while trying to find a saint to pick for Confirmation. I read and enjoyed her story. Later I was talking to my mom about what saint she picked for Confirmation and found out she had picked St. Bernadette. I knew that this was the right saint for me. I chose my Nana as my sponsor because she has always been my best friend since I was a child. She has always been there for me and has helped guide me through life as a Catholic.

After Confirmation, I plan to spend more time praying and being a good example for younger children. I also plan to go to church more often and serve the parish. I will participate in food and clothing drives, as well as activities like Sleep Out Saturday. I will talk about my faith outside of school and church. I will also continue my service work in preschool.

Who is calling you to be in this New Year? The Epiphany story points to the many ways God calls each one of us. Like the magi, we may experience a major moment of clarity when God's calling shines as brightly as a star in the night sky. More likely, we will experience God's callings in the midst of our everyday lives just as the magi did, in the fields of our homes, schools, and workplaces. How will you respond?

The Epiphany story draws our attention to divine revelation in and among creation. A star leads the magi to Jerusalem. After meeting with Herod, the magi follow that same star to the child Jesus. The guiding star glowed in the night sky as a sign of the divine presence. Creation offers the same direction to us today. Gaze up into the night sky tonight. Revel in the magnitude of stars shining against the darkness. Listen to God speaking through the natural world.


