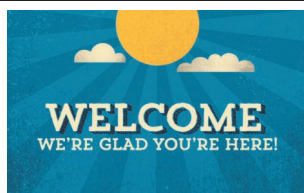

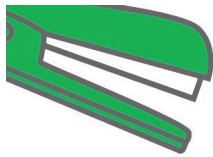

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The Illinois tax credit scholarship program has proven to be a beacon of hope and a guiding force toward a better life for thousands of Illinois students and their families. However, that light may be snuffed out unless the Illinois General Assembly acts to continue the law that provides for this program. Therefore, we are writing to ask you to contact your Illinois state representative and state senator to express your desire to retain the tax credit scholarship program.

Since its inception six years ago, the tax credit scholarship program has generated overwhelmingly positive results. Nearly 40,000 scholarships have been awarded to students attending private schools in the state. These scholarships are funded through contributions from donors who receive a 75% tax credit for their donation on their Illinois state income tax. All of the scholarships are need-based. Without this program, Illinois families may be unable to send their loved ones to the school of their choice. Demand for scholarships is high - for every scholarship granted, three students were turned down due to lack of funds.

Allowing the tax credit scholarship program to sunset would not only be a life altering disservice to the families it is designed to help, but would also create long-term consequences by weakening the state's educational choices and placing additional roadblocks in front of thousands of Illinois students on the path to a brighter future.

Please contact your state representative and state senator to let them know you support extending the tax credit scholarship program in Illinois law. We also encourage you to urge your fellow parishioners to do so also. Our collective voice is needed. (PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Building on the Cornerstone

Before I married my husband, I assumed there were “ugly houses” and “pretty houses,” and that was that. But Matt is an architect, someone who reads books with titles like “A Field Guide to American Houses” for fun and who uses the term *vernacular architecture* like he knows what it means.

Through him, I’ve come to learn a lot about why certain structures simply don’t have a pleasing look.

There is a logic to ugliness, as it turns out. One of the main reasons a building or a home might strike some of us as ugly is because it has undergone a careless renovation. Whether out of laziness or an effort to be cost-effective, additions are made that depart from the architectural style of the original structure. The result is slapdash, confusing—ugly, for lack of a better word. What is added on later must somewhat resemble the original. If you want to depart dramatically from the original style of a building, it’s better to build a separate structure altogether.

I think of this principle when I consider Christ as the “cornerstone.” We know we are called to model ourselves on Christ, to build on his example. But so often we cherry-pick elements of his message and attempt to build on it with additions that make no sense. When someone looks at us, at our lives, they should be able to tell after whom that life is patterned. We must resemble the cornerstone, if we do not, it will be apparent, unseemly. You can’t see God the Father without embracing God the Son. You can’t chart the future of a house without any thought for its past.

If Christ is not our inspiration, he will be our contradiction.

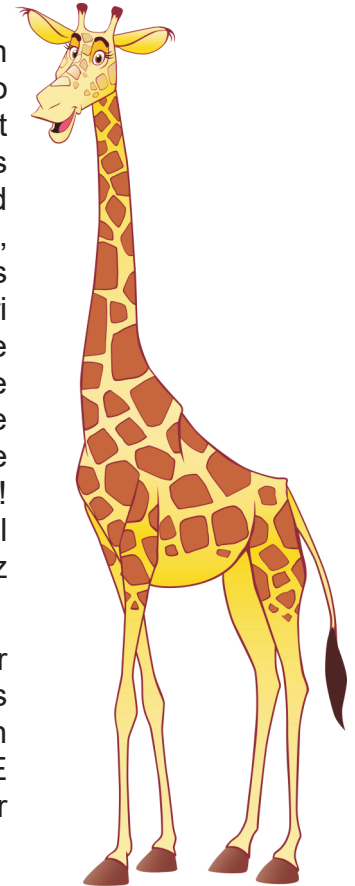

Please use the following reflection to help your family celebrate the Fifth Sunday of Easter.

Gospel Reading

[John 14:1-12](#)

Jesus tells his disciples, *"I am the way and the truth and the life."*

Members of the same family often bear close resemblances to one another. Sometimes physical resemblances are shared within a family, but often the similarities are behavioral characteristics and mannerisms. We hear this observation affirmed through a number of common phrases: *"He's a chip off the old block"* or *"She's her mother's daughter."* Today's Gospel points to a mystery of faith that might be examined in light of these familial relationships. In Jesus we see and know the Father. Likewise, the Father is known through the life and work of the Son, Jesus.

Talk together as a family about whether people outside of your family recognize common traits of your family. Are there physical resemblances that people recognize and so know each individual as a member of your family? Are there mannerisms that are shared by members of your family? What are some common interests and work that people might associate with your family? As you read today's Gospel, John 14:1-12, keep in mind that members of the same family share many characteristics, even though each person in the family is an individual. What does Jesus tell his disciples about his relationship with the Father? The relationship between the Father and Jesus is so close that Jesus says that those who have seen and known Jesus have also seen and known the Father. Jesus promises his disciples that because of their faith in him and in the Father, they too will be able to do the work of the Father as Jesus did. End your discussion by praying together that others will recognize in your family the work of the Father. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

"Do not let your heart be troubled." Jesus' decree comes on the heels of what any observer would call a troubling time for the disciples. Jesus just told the Twelve that he is to die—and that He is to die—and that His death will be brought about in part by the betrayal of one of them. Life is about to change drastically for the disciples. Grief looms on the horizon. Jesus knows the challenges to come—and still He declares, *"Do not let your hearts be troubled."* Jesus assures the disciples—and in turn, each of us—that the divine dwells with us always. We need not fear. We need not hold all the answers. We need only to believe in God's great love and power to bring light into the darkness. Does such a belief mean our hearts will never be troubled again? Most likely not. Our world is hurting. People on the planet are suffering under the weights of individual and structural sin and misfortune. Jesus is encouraging us to bring the stirrings of our to God. He is inviting us to trust that he is indeed *"the way, the truth and the life."*

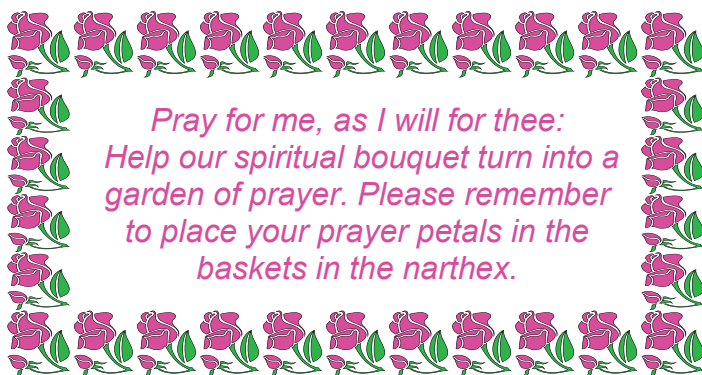
The reading from the Acts of the Apostles today is the institution of deacons in the church. As the number of those added to the church increased, the Apostles realized that they could no longer attend to the needs of everyone. Some of the new members felt neglected and marginalized so, in an effort to care for the community, Stephen and the other six were chosen. The function of the first deacons and the deacons of today remains one of "helper."

The Order of Deacon has become more visible in the church today, and the function of the deacon is not the same for all deacons. Just like everyone else, we have different gifts given by God to share with each other. We all share according to our abilities in respect to our gifts.

The Order of Deacon is one level of Holy Orders. Every priest and bishop were ordained a transitional deacon prior to being a priest. Deacon Phil and I were ordained as permanent deacons, meaning that we will not become priests. The role of being a bridge between the community and the parish priest, as well as to the bishop, is our place in the church hierarchy.

The primary role of a deacon is to minister to the community he is called to in the Liturgy, Word, and Service. Serving in liturgy the deacon can preside at various prayer services, baptisms, marriages, and assisting the priest at Mass. Service to the Word is done in our preaching and in instructing the community to understand God through the scriptures and in how to live faithful lives. The main service a deacon provides is to identify the needs of the community at large and the individuals of the church. This is the role the first deacons filled and is still the primary role. In doing so, the spiritual temporal needs of the community are met.

As with Stephen, the bishop laid hands on us as we were ordained and vowed our fidelity to our bishop and his successors for as long as we serve as deacons.

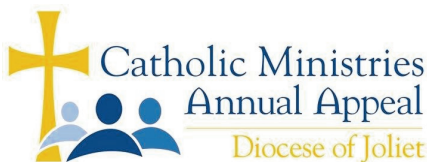
