






## **First Friday Eucharist Adoration**

## Divine Mercy Sunday Sunday, April 7th at 3:00 p.m. \* The Sunday after Easter \*

Please join us on Sunday, April 7, at 3:00 p.m. in St. Philip the Apostle Church for Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and Chaplet of Divine Mercy. You can also receive a gift of the Pardon Crucifix. Jesus told St. Faustina Kowalska, "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be

solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. The soul that will go to confess on eight days before or eight days after and receive Holy Communion on that day shall obtain complete forgiveness of their sins and punishment due to their sins." In 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and established Divine Mercy Sunday for the universal church. He died on April 2, 2005, on Saturday, the day before Divine Mercy Sunday. "The greater the sinner, the greater the right they have to my mercy." (From the diary of St. Faustina Kowalska)



Glory to God in the Highest! We as intentional disciples of Jesus have been given the promise of everlasting life. But this promise is not for us only - it is for all humanity. Sometimes it is difficult to acknowledge that God's plan of heaven is for all and not just "for those in the know." From earliest history, humans have dreamt

about the possibility of life after death. The Egyptians created extensive burial places. The Greeks and Romans spoke of Elysium. Middle Easterners had various versions of their understanding of Paradise. The Vikings spoke of Valhalla. Native Americans thought about the spirit world. Jesus spoke of the Kingdom of God noting that in His Father's house there are many dwelling places.

This is a day for thanking God for life, and to appreciate that we've had a six-week opportunity to prepare ourselves to be better followers of Jesus. Our question becomes: Can I maintain the effort it has taken during Lent to improve myself? Do we rather feel comfortable reverting to how we thought and acted before Ash Wednesday? Have we strengthened our intestinal fortitude sufficiently to overcome the natural inclination to take the easy road when we know Jesus wants us to take up our cross each day while letting Him help to carry our "yokes"?

Pondering the anticipated joys of heaven should help us remain intentional in our discipleship. Remembering we want to re-unite with all our loved ones who have been so instrumental in our lives, but who have gone before us, can be an encouragement to faithfulness despite the continuing difficulty of life on earth.

For the last few months my articles has focused on laity participation in the life of our parish. The survey results are still being analyzed by staff and pastoral council, but hopefully you are also reflecting on what you can do to become a more intentional participant in the life of St. Philip's. What talents and abilities do you have that can benefit our church family? What educational opportunities do you want to explore in order to increase your knowledge and understanding of our Christian

beliefs? How can you increase the fervor of your prayer life?



Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.


Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Liturgical Ministries: We need men, women, and children to become Lectors, Communion Ministers, Ushers, and Altar Servers. Please contact Deacon Philip Heitz, OFS if you are interested.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.

Even on Easter Sunday, the disciples do not quite get it. Jesus's resurrection is still hidden in mystery. There are hints here - an empty tomb and burial cloths. But Mary Magdalene misreads the empty tomb; she assumes that someone has taken Jesus's body. The fullness of what has happened has yet to be revealed. So it is for us, who live in the light of the resurrection and yet still experience pain and suffering and loss. Easter joy is not always accessible in its fullness, but we know there is more there than we can see. (Living Liturgy)
