

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We, the Catholic bishops of Illinois, write with a sense of urgency. Unless the General Assembly acts to renew the Invest in Kids scholarship program, more than 9,000 children currently relying on this program to attend a non-public school may have their educational path disrupted. Without an extension of the program in Illinois law now, no scholarships will be awarded for the school year that will begin in September 2024. Most of these children will have to leave the school their families determined was their best chance to receive a high-quality education in a safe and wholesome learning environment. This is an injustice that should and can be avoided, but only if the General Assembly acts when it reconvenes on October 24, 2023.

Invest in Kids has proven to be a beacon of hope for thousands of Illinois students and their families. Children receiving Invest in Kids scholarships come from lower-income families who could not otherwise afford tuition at the Catholic or another non-public school that is the best fit for their child. Childhood is a limited time in the life of a human being and primary and secondary education is not something that can be put off to some future date when it is convenient for adults. This is our one chance to offer these Illinois children a good start. Please help keep education options available and a brighter future possible by contacting your state senator and state representative and telling them to continue the Invest in Kids Program.

Since its inception six years ago, Invest in Kids has generated overwhelmingly positive results. Nearly 40,000 scholarships have been awarded to students attending non-public schools across Illinois. Demand for scholarships is very high - for every scholarship granted, three students are turned down due to lack of funds. Contrary to what you may have heard, this is not a voucher program, nor does it take state funds away from the public schools. These scholarships are funded through contributions from donors who receive a tax credit for their donation on their Illinois state income tax.

What can you do to help? Please contact your state senator and state representative to let them know of your support for extending the Invest in Kids tax credit scholarship program in Illinois. We also encourage you to urge your fellow parishioners to do the same. Our collective voice is vital to the continued help for Illinois families. If you love expressing your musical talents, please consider becoming a music minister here at St. Philip the Apostle Parish where you can use that talent while giving praise to God. Below are possible opportunities for you to share your love of music with the parish:

**Traditional Choir:** Traditional Choir is open to all adults beginning at high school age, and alternates each week singing at either the 8:00 a.m. or 10:00 a.m. Sunday Masses from September until the end of the Easter season. Practices are on **Thursdays from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m.** in the church.

**Contempo Choir:** The Contempo Choir is open to all adults beginning at high school age. We will sing once a month at the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, and practices are twice a month on **Tuesdays from 7:00** to 8:30 p.m.

**Resurrection Choir:** The Resurrection Choir is open to all who are able to participate at funeral Masses, which generally take place in the mid/late morning hours. There are no rehearsals, and the commitment is based solely on your availability—perfect for retirees and stay-at-home parents!

**Cantors:** Cantors are needed to help lead the congregation in song with a commitment of 1-2 Masses per month.

**Instrumentalists:** Experienced instrumentalists would be greatly appreciated at any of the weekend Masses. Time commitment is based on the individual's availability.

Kindergarten is settling in nicely to our daily routines. We start the day with reciting a scripture verse. Our September scripture verse was "Kind words are like honey, sweet for the soul and healthy for the body." Proverbs 16:34 We, then, work on applying using kind words each day, while learning the Bible has two parts (the Old/New Testament). Each month we change our scripture verse to connect to that month's activities. We finished up September with Johnny Appleseed, who was a kind and loving man that took care of God's creation. As we move into October, we will be learning to pray a decade of the Rosary every day, honoring the Rosary in the month of October. Our Math concepts include counting to 100 everyday and learning to subitize numbers 1-10. Rituals are powerful; they help us see what we otherwise might forget to look for. The same is true at home. Daily rituals and family traditions serve to show us and our children who we are and what matters to us. Here are some good opportunities to introduce rituals

into your family life.

**Bedtime** - Bedtime rituals can be a challenge at the end of a long day, but children often need help falling asleep as nighttime fears arise. Take this opportunity to introduce bedtime prayers to your children and to help them develop trust in God as our protector and provider. See this time spent as an investment in your child's spiritual and emotional wellness. As your children grow, don't abandon the bedtime ritual, but adapt it to suit their needs.

**Birthdays and Baptismal Days** - Birthday celebrations are great ways to emphasize that your children are unique and loved. Recognizing, in some significant way, your children's baptismal day is a great way to celebrate their relationship with God. A simple way to celebrate a baptismal anniversary is to light a candle, explain why you gave your child his or her name, and then spend a moment talking about the goodness you see in that child. In this way you will nurture the natural spirituality of your children and demonstrate that there is more to them than they probably know.

**Every Day** - Some of the best family fun can be had by developing little rituals that are unique to your lives together. There's many simple practices that celebrate the sacred. Perhaps every Friday night your family eats pizza, piles on the couch together, and watches a movie. Or perhaps New Year's Day is your family's day to go on a long hike in the woods. Value these rituals and know that they are anchors for your kids in a turbulent world.

**Meals** - Eating a family meal on a regular basis is a profound ritual. Begin the meal with prayer. Make time for everyone to share something about their day. Try fun meal-time questions like those in The Meal Box, they will encourage conversation, laughter, and sharing. Above all, make the table a welcoming, come-as-you-are place. Welcome friends, neighbors, and those in need to your table as well. Jesus did some of his best teaching from the dinner table. You can too, just by passing the potatoes. 

# DEACON PHILIP HEITZ, OFS Director of Liturgy & Adult Faith Formation Marriage/Baptismal Preparation

Have you purchased your garment for God's special wedding reception? How strong is the level of your discipleship? Let's continue our discernment process by further delving into the insights Fr. James Mallon provides in *Divine Renovations*.

Fr. Mallon notes that his parish has found that providing opportunities for parishioners to experience authentic community must be a priority. "It is just so easy for our people to get lost

in the crowd and to fall through the cracks, even those who have had authentic experiences of the Lord...Caring therefore needs to become the job of all, not just of the pastor. Only then will a Church become healthy."

His parish's solution for this need was to create lay-led, mid-sized connect groups of parishioners where each could become known, cared for, loved and called forth, but of a large enough size for people to be able to sit back and not be put under pressure. Parishioners usually joined a group after attending one of the parish's faith formation programs. Fr. Mallon soon recognized, however, that after the successful program ended, parishioners had no place to go to continue to be spiritually fed.

Another age old dilemma Fr. Mallon has noticed is that his parishioners' faith may appear on the outside with no corresponding reality within. The parish's goal is to find methods so parishioners will experience the Holy Spirit and come to a deeper appreciation of discipleship. Fr. Mallon notes that the apostles only became effective disciples after receiving charismatic gifts on Pentecost. Afterward, they had the courage to go out to the ends of the earth as Jesus' witnesses.

During the course of human history, the Spirit of the Lord has been given to particular people at particular times for particular purposes. Fr. Mallon notes that in contrast to what was experienced in a formerly dominant Catholic culture, post-moderns not only do not fear emotional religious experiences, they welcome them. He feels a healthy Church does not discredit or exclude experiences of the Holy Spirit, but has a robust respect for how the Spirit is manifested within the community, and evaluates every experience according to the fruits that the experience brings.

Parishes should teach that an emotional response to God is a healthy part of being in relationship with God just as it is in any other personal relationship.

In Galatians 5:22, St. Paul writes: "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control."

Fr. Mallon adds that another factor making his parish more vibrant was its seeking to become an inviting church. Successful, healthy and growing churches are intentional about creating an invitation culture. He acknowledges that the primary factor preventing the majority of parishioners from inviting others is fear of rejection, of being considered odd, of creating discomfort in a relationship, and of being considered "one of those" people. To this fear he responds with Jesus' constant refrain, "Do not be afraid."

How does St. Philip's respond to the above-mentioned challenges? How can we best learn to appreciate the special gifts we each have received from the Holy Spirit in baptism and confirmation? How do we lessen the fears involved in discipleship? These are some of the questions the staff is looking to you for help in our parish discernment process. We continue with our prayer that effective discernment will lead to a more engaged and loving St. Philip's community. May God give you peace.

The calendar is not always what it seems. There are times that our "normal" calendar does not line up with other things that mark the passage of time. We have a fiscal calendar, a school calendar (which can vary between types of school) and we also have a liturgical calendar. Whereas we may be familiar with these, we also

mark the passage of a year as we remember those who have died.

This calendar begins with the Feast of All Souls (November 2). Those who have gone before us and are now seated at the banquet God has prepared. Through faith, we believe their lives have

changed from mortal to everlasting.

Those who mourn have also had a change of life, being without the physical presence of our beloved dead can be a difficult reality. In the passing of time this reality becomes less painful, nonetheless it remains because of the impact they had on our life.

In the letter to the Romans Paul asks a question;" What will separate us from the love of Christ?"

The love that has been given to us in this life from the time of our conception is meant to be shared and in sharing that love with someone else, we give part of ourselves to them and they in turn give part of themselves to us.

When someone we loved has died and has gone back home to the Father the love that connected us in this life doesn't go away. The love that God planted within us is eternal. His presence and the presence that we shared with each other are everlasting. God's love planted in us knows no bounds and it continues to connect us as our lives change until the time that we all gathered together in heaven. Peace, Deacon Sean


