# **DEACON PHILIP HEITZ, OFS** Marriage/Baptismal Preparation

In his rule for monastic living, St. Benedict calls on his brothers to "receive all as Christ." Hospitality is a hallmark of Benedictine spirituality—and the broader Christian life. We need not be monks or nuns to practice the radical hospitality called for in St. Benedict's Rule and today's gospel. Jesus puts himself in the place of guest when he

tells his apostles: "Whoever receives you receives me." He ups the ante even further by adding: "and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me." What does is look like to receive or welcome another as Christ? How can we answer Jesus' call to take up our cross and follow him? Discipleship demands a radical embrace of the divine in our daily lives. Maybe that looks like seeking forgiveness from a colleague. Maybe it looks like welcoming the pain the pain of unhoused neighbors into your heart and allowing it to move you to action. Maybe the radical welcome to which Jesus calls us looks as simple as offering a "hi, how are you?" to the person sitting by themselves a few pews over. As we

### RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The funeral luncheon, the Irish wake, the vigil at an ailing loved one's bedside: in times of crisis, people gather. In moments of sadness, fear, and confusion, we gravitate toward one another. For some reason, the feelings are so much more bearable when we are not alone. I'm sure that the disciples and their companions, gathered in the upper room after the Lord's Ascension, did all of the things we typically do at these functions. I'm sure they hugged and talked and shared food, processing together the remarkable events they had witnessed. But we don't hear about any of that. We hear only that they prayed — fervently, and together. Saint John Paul II famously said that "it is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you." And I think that, whenever we gather, in good times or in bad, we think we are seeking companionship — but we are actually seeking God. As I think back on the last few crisis-gatherings my family has had, I try to remember when we have stopped everything to pray together. I can think of a few times, but to be honest, they are too few. We are usually occupied with more practical tasks: planning the funeral, talking to the doctor, making the decisions, ordering the food. Just trying to survive through it. But this is the busywork of sorrow, and it is a waste of our time. We would do better to follow the example of the disciples and remember that, in these dire moments, God is waiting for us. Please use the following reflection to help your family celebrate the Thirteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time. Gospel Reading (Matthew 10:37-42)

One can tell a lot about a family by the way they welcome others into their home. Despite parental efforts to elicit the best behavior from their children, family efforts to entertain guests are sometimes difficult. Practicing a spirit of Christian hospitality within the family can be an occasion to reflect upon the importance of this virtue. A family spirit of hospitality is a sign of faith.

When your family gathers, ask each person to consider the following questions about manners: What does it mean to be a good host? What does it mean to be a good guest? Invite each person to share their thoughts and experiences about being a guest or a host. When they have finished, read aloud today's Gospel, Matthew 10:37-42.

Ask family members to describe what Jesus says about hospitality extended to his disciples. (Those who receive Jesus' disciples also receive Jesus himself; hospitality to Jesus' disciples will be rewarded.) Then encourage family members to talk about what it means to be a good guest or a good host. You might also talk about ways in which your family's hospitality might be improved upon. Conclude in prayer together that your family grows to be one in which Christian hospitality is experienced by all. Pray together with the Lord's Prayer or today's Psalm. Source: Loyola Press
