

Please join us on **Sunday, April 7, at 3:00 p.m.** in **St. Philip the Apostle Church** for Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and Chaplet of Divine Mercy. You can also receive a gift of the Pardon Crucifix. Jesus told St. Faustina Kowalska, "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. The soul that will go to confess on eight days before or eight days after and receive Holy Communion on that day shall obtain complete forgiveness of their sins and punishment due to their sins." In 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and established Divine Mercy Sunday for the universal church. He died on April 2, 2005, on Saturday, the day before Divine Mercy Sunday. "The greater the sinner, the greater the right they have to my mercy." (From the diary of St. Faustina Kowalska)

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

If you recall, on Ash Wednesday, we heard the admonition of the prophet Joel to "call a solemn assembly" of the faithful to hear and experience the power of the Word of God. Now, Holy Week is upon us, and soon we will come with joy into the Easter Season. So now is the time to call again for an assembly of the people so that our tears of longing may be replaced with songs of joy.

This is Holy Week, the most sacred period of our Christian faith. It is a time when we gather together as a community of faith to journey with Jesus to Jerusalem, to stand with him before his accusers, to walk to Golgotha, and to stand at the foot of his cross. Finally, on Easter Sunday, we will joyously celebrate the resurrection of Christ, lifting our voices in praise of the hope that is ours and the world's.

With Palm Sunday (Passion Sunday) we solemnly begin the celebration of the core events of our faith. Jesus entered Jerusalem to suffer, die, and rise. In fervent prayer we follow the Lord as we hope to enter more fully into His Suffering, His Death, and His Resurrection. The Church calls out to all her faithful children to take notice of these sacred days. All are encouraged to assist at the Holy Week liturgies in person, especially the last three days which we call the Sacred Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil, which is the principal Easter celebration. Join us for all of it, if you can, remembering that without the journey of Holy Week, Easter loses its deep meaning.





The crowds were enamored with Jesus on Palm Sunday yet helped to kill him on Good Friday. Sometimes we are very faithful disciples interested in advancing the spirituality of our parish, but at other times we are self-centered and can't be bothered with Church as individuals. As we all easily recognize, being an intentional disciple of Jesus takes effort and a willingness to brush ourselves off after we fail in our attempts at being good Christians.

As we continue to analyze our own efforts at discipleship, let's further consider Leonard Doohan's book, *The Lay-Centered Church*. He notes "Discipleship is the embodiment, individually and as Church, of the gifts and obligations received in baptism...This will include meditation on the Word, prayer, sharing with the community of faith, ongoing education, and some clearly identified involvement in ministry...the disciple should be a person of compassion, forgiveness and understanding...patiently lives out this call step by step in interaction with the surrounding world...The three principal evangelical counsels challenge all Christians to live in a just relationship to things... person to person...and person to society."

Doohan continues "...we are dealing with a committed Christian who, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and molded by the environment, responds anew in a Christlike way to local needs and circumstances."

He concludes: "One of the chief characteristics of lay men and women today is their growing sense of being adult members of the church. Adulthood implies knowledge, experience and awareness, freedom and responsibility, and mutuality in relationships."

This next week provides an opportunity for us to delve deeply into our personal faith journey. Please attend the events of the triduum. Share the Bread of Life on Holy Thursday and appreciate the gift of the Eucharist, Christ sharing His essence with us. Walk with Jesus to Calvary so as to sense the amount of love Jesus has for us. Celebrate on Holy Saturday with those who will be received into the Church to support their decision to become disciples.

May you truly experience God's presence in your life this week.



This Lenten season is coming to an end, and for me this past week has been a time of reflection and remembrance. With Palm Sunday here I remember what it was like as a child at St. George Parish in Tinley Park. We gathered on the parking lot behind the church and were handed our palms to be blessed. Then in solemn procession we were led by the altar servers, priest and choir leading us in song around all the cars and into the church to praise and receive Christ our King into our hearts and bodies. At that time, I did not realize how Christ was present in many forms. He is present in the scriptures proclaimed, He is present in the Eucharist we receive, and He is present in the people who gathered. The presence of Christ surrounded and filled us as we worshipped Him and acknowledge His willingness to die for all, so we may share in His glory.

We still know that Jesus is with us to surround and fill us with His presence. His presence is still in the scriptures, the songs we sing, and in the people around us. Most importantly it is in the Eucharist, which sustains and strengthens and heals us, the promised fulfilled that He is to be with us always until the end of time.

The love of God knows no boundaries. As we receive the palms, we receive His Sacred Body. We experience Him in the words of scripture and with the people who are with us. We can gather as God's family and share their meaning with each other. We pray and worship as the early Christians did in their home. Where 2 or 3 gather in my name, I am with them.

The faith that our parents instilled in us from the time that we were children never leaves us and will sustain us in all adversity.

Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.
