As I was getting off the bike, my foot got caught on the crossbar and I fell. I landed on my elbow, and the full forces of my skinny body went into my upper left arm. There is a spiral fracture going all the way up the humerus and a second crack at the top of the bone. Six months minimum healing time and, given my age, probably more like a year.

Surgery is an option but wouldn't help much with recovery time, and my cardiologist says with my faulty heart valve I probably wouldn't survive the anesthetic. I will start saying weekend masses in September and probably weekdays as well. Get used to seeing me with my left arm tucked under my shirt for a while. Keep me in your prayers. Be well and safe....

Reading 1: Is 22:19–23

Thus says the LORD to Shebna, master of the palace:

“I will thrust you from your office and pull you down from your station.

On that day I will summon my servant Eliakim, son of Hilkiyah;

Gospel (Mt 16:13–20)

Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi and he asked his disciples, “*Who do people say that the Son of Man is?*” They replied, “*Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.*” He said to them, “*But who do you say that I am?*” Simon Peter said in reply, “*You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.*” Jesus said to him in reply, “*Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.*” Then he strictly ordered his disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ.

In today’s passage from Romans, Paul concludes his complex reflections on the Jewish people, the emerging Gentile churches, and God’s work among them. Paul has struggled to understand the responses of both the Jewish and Gentile communities, with their mix of acceptance and rejection of Jesus. He warns the Roman church to avoid any sense of superiority over Jews or non-Christian Gentiles, for everyone is in need of God’s mercy. Paul acknowledges the limits of his understanding, and gives way to prayers of awe and praise. He concludes by marveling at the limitless mercy of God, whose designs are ultimately mysterious.

Sometimes our own prayer can be like that of Paul. In conversation with God, we try to make sense of life, especially its difficulties. The full truth of what’s going on in our lives or in our world eludes us, and so we work humbly with the truth that we can understand. If we believe our mysterious God is indeed trustworthy, we can open our hearts in praise, and allow God to shape our lives.

Last year's classes ended so abruptly that we were unable to send any registration information home with the children as we normally do, but we have sent it out electronically via School Messenger and also offer the forms on-line at st-phil.org. I have been working on and praying about the upcoming school year and what our RE Program might look like. I was required by the Diocese of Joliet to submit a plan for the fall including: building procedures, cleaning protocol, social distancing, and contact tracing requirements for COVID-19. Parish staff and I have discussed all of the options for in-classroom learning. Taking into account the safety of our religious education students and volunteers, funding limitations, and space restrictions which make it difficult to have classes in the school building, we have reached a consensus and will implement a family-centered, remote-learning religious education program for the 2020/2021 school year. It is my intention and hope that this will be a wonderful and prayerful experience for families. We will provide textbooks along with a schedule for learning, and I am developing an on-line Gospel Weekly available through our website, as well as many more digital resources to use as needed and desired. The only grades that will be required to attend virtual class sessions will be Grades 2 and 8 who are preparing for the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation. Their classes will be held via Google Meet or a similar platform. Attendance is required for the students to receive their Sacraments. Catechists for the remaining grades will contact the families on a regular basis to check in and stay in touch. Hopefully, the religion education studies will become a time of family prayer and faith discussion, rather than a log-in on the computer. It is our intention and plan to return to in-classroom learning in the fall of 2021. I hope all of our families will stay with us this year so their child(ren) will not miss important preparation for the next grade level. As in the past, tuition for home study is the same as in-classroom study. I will be in contact with our families regarding dates and times for pick-up of materials and, as always, will keep them informed of any changes and on-going updates. Please forward this information to any families who were not in the program last year. Our religious education families—and all of our parishioners—are in my prayers as we move forward in these trying times.

Please remember in your prayers the following St. Philip the Apostle Religious Education students who will be celebrating their belated (originally scheduled for May 2, 2020) First Eucharist on Saturday, August 29, at 11:00 a.m. These families are participating in a very different experience than they thought they would, but they do understand that the gathering, the party, and the gifts are secondary to what is really important—their children's reception of Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time.

“Who do you say that I am?” Jesus asked his disciples this question—and it also applies to us today. *What is your image of God? How has it changed over the years of your life?* These are two questions that are asked of our RCIA candidates at the beginning of their formation.

Most of us, at least when we are young, think of God as a grey-bearded grandfather who is loving but firm. As we get older, our image of God changes due to the circumstances of our lives and how we developed our relationship with Him. In any long-term friendship, our ability to be near or far from each other varies from time to time. The same is true with God. Sometimes we depend so much on his presence that we cannot imagine being without Him. These are usually times of sorrow or distress when we have nowhere else to turn. However, we also rejoice with Him when our prayers are answered. When we accomplish something, we occasionally feel we did it “all on our own,” or when we don’t receive the answer “we want,” we turn away from Him and feel abandoned. If we look back on our lives as a whole, we may see that God has always been with us through thick and thin—like a friend who helps us to take control of a situation or who just sits quietly by us allowing us to decide what we truly want. Isn’t that what a true friend would do?

When making reservations for the weekend Masses, please call the Parish Office at 630-628-0900 x0 from Monday at 9:00 a.m. through Thursday at 2:30 p.m., or enter your reservation through the link on the St. Philip the Apostle website (st-phil.org), or through the parish Facebook page (<https://www.facebook.com/StPhilipAddisonIL/>). If you don't make a reservation, but plan on attending a weekend Mass, you run the risk that there may not be any seats available. Also, please remember the doors will be locked ten minutes prior to Mass starting. This is to ensure everyone is checked in and seated before Mass begins. Registrations are not needed for the 8:00 a.m. weekday Masses, but all other COVID-19 protocols will be followed including the wearing of masks, social distancing, temperature checks, and well-being questions. There seems to be some confusion when registering for weekend Masses as to what category should be used. We have re-evaluated the registration process and have decided to have just one category (General Admission) to simplify the process. So, if you are a family, couple, or single person, you will sign up for the General Admission and put how many people are coming under your registration. Thankfully, the numbers are rising for attendance, but that means we need to ensure we are abiding by the diocesan guidelines set by the bishop. We are in great need of more volunteers to help out with set-up, clean-up, and ushering/greeting at both Masses. Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.


