

4 STEPS TO SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

As part of their preparation for Confirmation, the eighth grade students from the school and Religious Education Program wrote letters to the parish to introduce themselves and explain why they want to become adults in the Church. Below is a letter from Joseph Cacucciolo who attends St. Philip the Apostle School.

Dear St. Philip the Apostle Parish,

My name is Joey Cacucciolo. I am 13 years old and am in 8th grade preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. I have a family of five: my mom, my dad, my two brothers and myself. Some things I like to do for fun is to invite my friends over on the weekends and play video games together. My mom's name is Maria and my dad's name is Vito. My two brothers are Filippo and Marco. Filippo is older than me and Marco is younger than me.

I chose St. Anthony of Padua to be my saint name for Confirmation. I chose St. Anthony because I really liked his story and I thought that he was a really amazing saint. St. Anthony of Padua is the patron saint of lost things so that when you lose something that you really like you can pray to him and he will help guide you to find your belongings. I wanted to choose St. Anthony of Padua because I think that he will help me greatly throughout my life.

My sponsor's name is Tony Palozzolo, and he is also my uncle. He is 50 years old. I chose him to be my sponsor because he is very loving and caring, and I know I can trust him. He is also very funny and likes to make jokes. He has two daughters Bella and Gigi, which are my cousins who have also gone to this school.

After Confirmation I can live my life more fully as a Catholic by helping others and being more devoted to my faith. Being more devoted to my faith will help me to live by Christ's guide and to follow the Ten Commandments. Confirmation will also give me the Holy Spirit as a friend that will help me make choices and decisions that are very complicated. The Holy Spirit will act as my guardian and will protect me from making bad choices.

I want to be confirmed because I want to strengthen my relationship with God. I want to grow in the Catholic Church and be recognized as a good leader in the Catholic faith. Being confirmed is important to me because I want to know God better.

I plan to serve my parish in the future by becoming a practicing Catholic and participating in Masses and helping others in the parish. I can also be a practicing Catholic by offering help to others who need it and also being there for people who aren't feeling well.

Finally, a big "thank you" to the people who donated to this year's Sleep Out Saturday fundraiser. We were able to give a check for \$2,427 to Bridge Communities, which I think is a great total considering this year's challenges!

The Jewish people were waiting for their messiah, they were waiting for a hero. They prodded John several times trying to figure out what his role actually was, and to see what he knew. It became a guessing game. He tried to say nothing, but finally answered in a humble fashion, "I am not he." He baptized with water as a means of leading people to the coming Christ and helping them to prepare. He somehow avoided the trappings of success that would turn his light on himself. Today he remains a road sign for us, pointing out Christ our Light. We all want someone to rescue us, and most likely to fix the mistakes and errors that we continue to make as individuals and as nations. Much of that is human nature. Would there be as much fascination with superheroes if this were not the case? How many times do you as an adult turn to your folks for advice, or wish you could talk to a deceased parent? Some need help emotionally, others spiritually, others financially. The reality is that it is tough to get your "ducks in a row" and always has been. Today's encouraging message is for us to always look to the Light for our help. May we always be like John the Baptist and testify how Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, has been our Savior. Today's gospel tells us that John the Baptist was born into the world for a singular purpose, "to testify to the light." And not just any light, but "the light of the human race" (John 1:4; NABRE), "the light [that] shines in the darkness," that the darkness can never overpower (1:5). One of the reasons the feast of Christmas was originally placed on December 25 was to highlight the symbolism of celebrating the birth of the one who proclaimed himself "the light of the world" (John 8:12) during the darkest day of the Northern Hemisphere's winter. Whether we find ourselves in the Northern or

Southern Hemisphere on this Gaudete Sunday, there is plenty of darkness to be encountered: poverty, war, violence, hatred, greed, and all manners of evil. When we turn our gaze to our own suffering and that of others, it is easy to become discouraged. How can any light possibly brighten the darkness? How are we being called, at this moment in human history, to testify to the light that no darkness can overcome?





Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.


