



It is time to make plans for the 2021-22 school year. We appreciate the support and dedication our families have given to St. Philip the Apostle School. This year, we will be changing the re-enrollment process to automatic re-enrollment. This will simplify the process and eliminate the need for parents/guardians to go into SchoolSpeak to re-enroll students. If for any reason, you decide not to re-enroll, then please let us know via email or phone call by February 12. An early bird registration fee of \$50 per student is available until February 12, 2021, and may be paid by clicking the Re-Enrollment Early

Bird Payment Link. This will also guarantee you a spot in your child(ren)'s class. After February 12, the fee will increase to \$100 per student, and there must be an open spot in the class you are registering for. Tuition rates for the 2021-22 school year have not yet been finalized, but we expect that to have them ready by the end of the month. For budgeting purposes, the cost of tuition and fees usually increases between 3% and 5%.

We will be hosting several Virtual Preview Days for prospective families. This is a chance for them to see the classrooms virtually and gather more information. Please tell your friends, family, and neighbors about the good things happening at St. Philip the Apostle School. The preview day for Grades 1-4 is February 24 and for Grades 5-8 is March 23.

In the middle of today's gospel we hear of a rather striking scene. "When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door." It seems as if everyone in Capernaum has been touched in some way by sickness. Whether ill themselves, or the friend or family member of someone who is ailing, all the townspeople have drawn near to the healer and wonderworker who just that morning spoke in the synagogue with authority and astonished many with his teaching. His works of healing prove to be the best possible way of spreading the good news that God's reign has drawn near. By the end of just one day in Capernaum the entire town is gathered at Jesus' doorstep, eager to listen to his words and come close to the power of his healing. As Christians we, too, are called to be healers and to bring Jesus' mercy to the broken places in our society. May we proclaim in our actions that Jesus is "Emmanuel," God who desires to be with us always, not only or even primarily in placed of joy and peace but also where we find the deepest pain and suffering.

During these past eleven months many of us probably have had some extra time on our hands. We haven't been able to go out to eat as much as we used to or go to a movie or wander around a mall. What have you done with this time? Maybe you decided to tackle that long overdue home remodeling project, or clean out that closet where things tumble out every time you open the door, or get rid of clutter from the rest of your house. These are always good things to do from time to time. We all accumulate things that once had a purpose but now just take up space in our houses and garages, and those things need to find a new home. Our spiritual lives may also be in need of some reevaluation. Taking the time to reflect on where we are in our relationship with God can help us to see the purpose God has for our lives. In today's gospel we hear of Jesus taking time for himself after healing many people the previous night. When his disciples came to tell him the people wanted to see him again, he told them that he had to move on in order to continue the work he was sent for. The same is true for us. We all need to take the time to look at what we are doing and determine if we are spending our time in worthwhile ventures. Are we doing all we can to be the presence of Christ to others? Are we offering all we can to those around us—be it family, friends or people we haven't met yet?

Reservations for Ash Wednesday Masses &

Prayer Services will open on Sunday, February 7.

Masses will be at 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.;

prayer services will be at 12:15 p.m. and 4:00 p.m.

- ◆ There will only be two people (the Presider and Extraordinary Minister of Communion) giving ashes at the front of the church.
- ◆ The Presider will say the prayer for blessing the ashes.
- ◆ The Presider, without saying anything, will sprinkle the ashes with Holy Water.
- ◆ The Presider will address the church ONLY ONCE as he/she says, "*Repent and believe in the Gospel*" or "*Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return.*"
- ◆ The Presider will sanitize his hands, put on his face mask and shield, and distribute ashes.
- ◆ The Presider and Extraordinary Minister of Communion will sprinkle ashes on the head of each one without saying anything. (Only a small amount of ash is sprinkled by rubbing the thumb and forefinger together over the head of the recipient.)
- ◆ Hands are then cleansed and sanitized.

Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.


