

As part of their preparation for Confirmation, the eighth grade students in the RE Program and St. Philip the Apostle School write letters to the parish to explain why they want to be Confirmed. Below is the letter from St. Philip the Apostle School student Alex Nowak.

"If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy." These words from the second reading remind us of our intricate and intimate interconnectedness with others and all of God's creation. There is power and strength in community. If we are willing to accept help from others during our difficult times, we must also stand ready to assist others when they experience challenges and hardships. We cannot opt in to community when it is convenient. Rather, part of living and working in communion with others is recognizing that we all succeed together or fail together.

Part of the communal reality is recognizing and naming our own gifts. When we can name our strengths without self-absorption or false humility, we are able to better recognize how we can use these gifts for the service of others. Paul writes, *"God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended."* When each person uses their individual gifts for the common good, the community grows and flourishes. The same is true for the workings of our human body.

In Luke, the baptism and desert trials of Jesus lead to the synagogue scene, which will then lead Jesus to his public ministry of proclaiming the reign of God. 

SENIORS INVITED TO DEFER PROPERTY TAXES

Qualified senior citizens, aged 65 years and older, are invited to apply for the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. The program allows participants to defer property tax payment until the property is sold. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 6% simple interest until paid. To qualify, the applicant's household income cannot exceed \$55,000. Additionally the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes.

The application period closes March 1, 2022.

Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.


