SENIORS INVITED TO DEFER PROPERTY TAXES

Qualified senior citizens, aged 65 years and older, are invited to apply for the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. The program allows participants to defer property tax payment until the property is sold. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 6% simple interest until paid. To qualify, the applicant's household income cannot exceed \$55,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes.

The application period closes March 1, 2021.

It is time to make plans for the 2021-22 school year. We appreciate the support and dedication our families have given to St. Philip the Apostle School. This year, we will be changing the re-enrollment process to automatic re-enrollment. This will simplify the process and eliminate the need for parents/guardians to go into SchoolSpeak to re-enroll students. If for any reason, you decide not to re-enroll, then please let us know via email or phone call by February 12. An early bird registration fee of \$50 per student is available until February 12, 2021, and may be paid by clicking the Re-Enrollment Early Bird Payment Link. This will also guarantee you a spot in your child(ren)'s class. After February 12, the fee will increase to \$100 per student, and there must be an open spot in the class you are registering for. Tuition rates for the 2021-22 school year have not yet been finalized, but we expect that to have them ready by the end of the month. For budgeting purposes, the cost of tuition and fees usually increases between 3% and 5%.

We will be hosting several Virtual Preview Days for prospective families. This is a chance for them to see the classrooms virtually and gather more information. Please tell your friends, family, and neighbors about the good things happening at St. Philip the Apostle School. The preview day for Grades 1-4 is February 24 and for Grades 5-8 is March 23.

We will host an Open House to kick off Catholic Schools Week on Sunday, January 31, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for all grades. Tours are by appointment only and may be made by calling the school office at 630-543-4130.

Today we read Jesus' first spoken words in the Gospel of Mark: *"This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."* Within these three statements we find the general thesis for the whole of Jesus' preaching. First, Jesus declares the time of fulfillment. While Jesus might be speaking of his life, when the Son of God has come to earth and a new moment in the history of salvation has begun, we can also find within these words a message of hope and challenge for us in the twenty-first century. In each moment our God is actively reaching for us, inviting us to join him. It is never too late or too early to respond to his invitation. Like John the Baptist, Jesus calls his listeners to repentance. The Greek word for repentance (metanoia) evokes more than just a sorrow for individual sins, but an actual turning of one's whole being toward the Lord. As we continue on our journey of faith, returning to Jesus' first words in the gospel can help orient us to the heart of Jesus preaching: Now is the time; be a part of the kingdom; turn your whole lives toward God.

Our readings today speak of "Kairos" times, of God proclaiming new moments of opportunity of encounter with the Divine. From Jonah, we hear of God's summons to the people of Nineveh to turn from evil. We hear Paul tell the church in Corinth that those who live in Christ must avoid clinging to anything transient, as all is secondary to God. And we hear of the beginning of Jesus' ministry in Mark, as Jesus proclaims a moment of both opportunity and crisis. In these passages, there are no delaying tactics, no getting caught up in life's distractions. Just a simple moment of choice. Perhaps we have had "Kairos" moments like these, or we may be facing one now. Sometimes, amid the complexities and uncertainties of our lives, clear choices emerge, and God asks us to choose. And our always patient and merciful God will accompany us in our choices.

Today's readings all have one thing in common: the call of God to change our lives or to affect a change in the lives of others. These two aspects have the same goal in mind. They bring about a closer union with God through obedience. A calling may lead to a life of consecration through Holy Orders or to the religious life of a nun, sister, or brother in a religious order. While these vocations are needed and should be encouraged, there is a calling that all of us can fulfill. A response to the call of God at its most basic level is to love one another by taking an active interest in their lives. This can be as simple as listening to a person who just needs his or her voice heard. It can be reaching out to assist in a struggle by giving advice or pointing them to someone else who has expertise in their area of concern. Either way, we are making the kind of impact that can change a life for the better. God calls all of us at some point to use the gifts he has blessed us with to be a positive force in our world. His call is subtle, and we need to listen closely to determine what it is. Then, when we know what is asked of us, we may respond. In doing so, the blessing of God will rest upon us and those we help.

Proclaiming the Gospel of God.

Jesus is very busy in the beginning of Mark's gospel—proclaiming, teaching, healing—and calling others to come and follow. The responses of Simon, Andrew, James, and John were immediate: stopping what they were doing, leaving it all behind without hesitation—they followed him. Stay tuned to this whole liturgical year to see where that leads.

What of the good news of God is Jesus proclaiming to me today?

How am I hesitating in giving Jesus Christ my immediate attention and response?

What am I leaving behind, stopping doing in order to follow Jesus in more faithful ways?

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.


