**Sunday Readings for July 19, 2020 (Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)**

**Reading 1 (Wis 12:13, 16–19)**

There is no god besides you who have the care of all, that you need show you have not unjustly condemned. For your might is the source of justice; your mastery over all things makes you lenient to all. For you show your might when the perfection of your power is disbelieved; and in those who know you, you rebuke temerity. But though you are master of might, you judge with clemency, and with much lenience you govern us; for power, whenever you will, attends you. And you taught your people, by these deeds, that those who are just must be kind; and you gave your children good ground for hope that you would permit repentance for their sins.

### Reading 2 (Rom 8:26–27)

Brothers and sisters: The Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes with inexpressible groanings. And the one who searches hearts knows what is the intention of the Spirit, because he intercedes for the holy ones according to God's will.

### Gospel (Mt 13:24–43 or Mt 13:24–30)

Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn." ' ' ' He proposed another parable to them. "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the 'birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches.' " He spoke to them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed with three measures of wheat flour until the whole batch was leavened." All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables. He spoke to them only in parables, to fulfill what had been said through the prophet: I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world. Then, dismissing the crowds, he went into the house. His disciples approached him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field." He said in reply, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels. Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

**WHAT IS OUR LEAVEN?** In our own growth, something usually spurs us on and calls us to change. For a young couple who find out they are expecting, this may be the impetus to "grow up" and straighten out their spending habits.

For another, perhaps a heart attack or prolonged illness calls one to wake up and gives one a second chance at life. Losing a job or a spouse or surviving a car accident may mean it is time for a "do-over." Isn't it amazing to realize that we are blessed with a tender, loving God who will walk through all these changes in our lives, who is cajoling us into a better self? Here is a God who doesn't pull the plug because of our sins, but is willing to wait and sort and "gather the wheat."

Let us be grateful for this gift of loving mercy. Recall the simple prayer found in Psalm 86:15–16:

*"You, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in kindness and fidelity.*

*Turn toward me, and have pity on me; give your strength to your servant."*

Jesus' parables always deal with real, everyday occurrences such as the farmer sowing grain, a shepherd searching for a lost sheep, or a merchant searching for pearls. Within the parables, though, there is usually something shocking that takes place such as the shepherd leaving 99 of his sheep defenseless in the wilderness in order to go after one that was lost, or a Samaritan being the hero of the story instead of the villain. We find these surprising elements in our parables today as well. For instance, have you ever heard of a gardener who was against weeding? In the parable of the wheat and the weeds, the householder makes the unorthodox decision to let the wheat and the weeds all grow together. He doesn't want to risk anything harming the wheat and so decides he will leave it until the harvest when the two can be separated. We might ponder, along with Jesus' first listeners, what might this tell us about the kingdom of God and God's Justice? In the parable of the leaven, the amount of flour used by the woman provides the element of surprise. Three measures of wheat flour would have been enough to feed a hundred people, and yet the yeast has the power to cause this flour to change and grow and become something that is nourishing for others. What might this parable tell us about the power, growth and abundance of the kingdom of God? To fully enter into a parable, one must be willing to let go of the security offered by answers and definitions. Most of the parables Jesus offered did not come with explanations. Instead, just as Jesus' first listeners did, we are invited to ponder and wrestle with what this living word has to teach us today.



**Parish Registration:** New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

**Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls:** Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.


