



Sixth grade catechist Sal Ferenzi replied, "That is very thoughtful of you. It's hard when someone you like moves away. I'm sure it's just as difficult for them to find new friends. When you put yourself in other's positions, and you understand how they feel, you are showing love towards that person. Jesus said, 'Love thy neighbor,' and that is what your doing, even though she is not close by."

Massimo Pulice gave the following response to this question about Lent. "Can you remember a Lenten season when you gave up something only to go right back to it on Easter Sunday?" Massimo replied, "I gave up candy and when it was Easter Sunday I went into my kitchen and ate all the candy I saw." Mr. Sal replied, "Your response made me laugh; I hope you didn't get a stomach ache from eating all the candy. I'm sure your dentist was happy too. Giving up something helps to strengthen us, but returning back to what you gave up right after Easter does not help to build character. What you probably should do is pray for someone for those 40 days, and then continue to pray for someone else for another 40 days, and then continue praying. This is what Lent is all about." We know that God cannot be contained in space and time but lives outside of these constructs and so we can say he is present in every time and every place. And yet for us as humans, very much constricted by the confines of space and time, it is important to have particular places to encounter the living God. For this need we have been given the Sabbath, a day each week set apart for rest and reconnection with God. Ever since the beginning of God's covenant with Abraham, human beings have dedicated physical spaces for worship—from altars build by the nomads, to the Ark of

the Covenant carried with the people as they journeyed to the promised land, and then finally the temple constructed in Jerusalem. The final verses from today's gospel tell us that we need not be afraid to draw near to God due to our sin and failing, for Jesus "did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well." In his person, Jesus redeems human nature, intimately marrying it with the divine. We gather together around the altar of the Lord each week desiring to be cleansed from all that separates us from God, knowing that he also desires to be in communion with us.

Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.


