**HOLY WEEK & EASTER COVID PROTOCOLS**  
*(Registration is required for all Masses and services listed below. Please visit [st-phil.org](http://st-phil.org) to register.)*

**Holy Thursday (April 1, 2021, from 7:00 to 10:00 p.m.)**

There will be no Foot Washing Ritual at the Holy Thursday Service. There will be a short procession from the altar to the ambry with the Holy Oils that will be received prior to Holy Thursday. For Adoration, the area in front of the Altar of Repose will be for standing only. Since Adoration is part of Mass, we still need to maintain our limitations on church capacity, social distancing, masks, and sanitizing.

**Good Friday (April 2, 2021, at 7:00 p.m.)**

The recommendation from the Joliet Diocese is to have the priest raise the cross and place it in front of the altar for silent adoration (no procession/veneration of the cross).

**Holy Saturday (April 3, 2021, at 11:00 a.m.)**

The Easter Basket Blessing will be outside of the church to ensure social distancing. Masks are required. Weather permitting.

**Holy Saturday (April 3, 2021, at 7:00 p.m.)**

The Joliet Diocese has asked that we limit the number of people that gather outside for the lighting of the Paschal Candle to ensure social distancing. There will be no individual candles used during Mass.

**Easter Sunday (April 4, 2021)**

**Masses at 8:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 12:30 p.m.**

Sunday Masses will be as normal. No congregating or pictures will be allowed in the church or narthex after the Masses so the church can be sanitized and cleaned before the next Mass starts.

St. Philip the Apostle Parish would like to extend our prayers to you and your families during this Holy Week. It may be different than years past, especially 2020, when we all could only celebrate from our homes. These guidelines have been put in place by the CDC and the Joliet Diocese for your protection. We greatly appreciate your cooperation through this holy time.

Last week's question for the sixth grade students was, "Was there ever a time when your strong faith in God brought about a change of heart? How did it change you?" Nicolas Ruberto responded, "I think about all of the people in my family who we have lost, like my mom lost her dad, my grandpa, to cancer before I was born. My mom has so many stories about what a good man he was. She said he was always happy and smiling. There really isn't a bad thing anyone has to say about him. So it makes me think about why I couldn't have met him before he passed away. I know I can't change anything but my mom says he is always around us watching over us. And even though I didn't get to see him, he sees me everyday and is always around me. That makes me feel better because I know from heaven he is always with me in my heart, and he sees me grow up, and watches over me." Catechist Sal Ferenzi replied, "Good evening, Nicolas, what a beautiful response. We are so sorry for your loss. I'm sure every time your mom looks at you, she sees a reflection of her father. Sometimes God's ways are not always our ways, and we must accept what happens, even though it hurts us. Your mom is so right in saying that he is watching over you. When we think of our loved ones and hold them in our hearts, they will always be with us. God bless you and your family. Mr. Sal" I am so proud of the work our parents, students, and catechists have put in this year, especially since they couldn't meet in person. As you can see from all the thoughtful student and catechist responses provided in my column during these months, religious education is more than learning prayers and how to receive Communion correctly. It encourages our parish children to really think about what it means to be a person of faith in the world today, and how the Church can provide answers, guidance, and support for them in their faith journey to adulthood.

This year, we hear the Passion from the gospel of Mark. One thing unique about this reading is the emphasis on Jesus being abandoned by his disciples. First, the leaders of the disciples cannot even support Jesus in his agony in the garden: They fall asleep, three times. Then there is Judas, who seeks out the chief priests to make a deal with them, Peter, who denies Jesus three times, and the crowds who cried, "Hosanna!" a few days before, now call for him to be crucified. What does this tell us? With friends like these, who needs enemies? No, the point is that Jesus died specifically for these people, not because they were once friends, but because they were sinners, who needed Jesus. When we find ourselves in sin, when we think that everything we do is wrong, or when we think we can't possibly deserve to be loved by God—that is when God can help us, if we just stop hating ourselves and start loving and trusting the Lord. It is not the time to pretend we have avoided the big sins, or to brag about some of the good we may have done. Instead simply agree that you need his help. God loves sinners who know they need his forgiveness and don't deserve it. But maybe you have already been forgiven and wonder what's next. Remember the ones you would not expect to support Jesus: the centurion proclaiming him Son of God, Joseph giving him a burial place, the women who followed Jesus. These were people who did not claim to be worthy, just did what they could to show their love. Ask Jesus each morning when you wake up, "What can I do for you today?" and do what you can.

At the Last Supper, gathered with his closest friends, Jesus offers one last foreshadowing of what is to come. Over the bread he says, *“Take it; this is my body.”* And over the wine, *“This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many.”* Earlier in the gospel Jesus had told the disciples, *“Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.”* (Mark 8:34; NABRE) And now we come to the point where we see where this journey ends, in the complete gift of self, just as bread that is broken and wine that is poured out to be consumed by others. In Holy

Week, we live in the moments of Jesus’ self-gift at the Last Supper and on Calvary. In faith, we know we cannot pass on what we have not received ourselves. Before considering how we are to emulate Jesus in giving each moment of our lives for God and others, we first must be grounded in Jesus’ gift of himself to us as a community, and also to each of us individually. May we hear the words of our Lord reverberating deep in our hearts, *“Take and eat, take and drink, I desire to give all of myself to you.”*



Today we commemorate the triumphant entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem and the beginning of Holy Week. On Holy Thursday the Paschal Triduum begins. This is our walk with Jesus through His last days on earth. The Triduum commemorates the events of Holy Thursday, the institution of the Eucharist; Good Friday, the day Jesus died for our sins on the Cross that would become the tree of life; and Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil, the evening we all await the Light of the World to shine on mankind with the dawn of Easter morning. During these liturgies we experience the Trinity. Even though this may seem like three different events they are, in fact, one. On Holy Thursday we receive the memorial of Christ when he gives us his very self in the Eucharist, his body and blood as the food of life nourishing us for this life and life eternal. Then Jesus shows us that we need to submit ourselves to God and the service of others in the washing of the disciples' feet. On Good Friday we continue to walk with Jesus as He shows us that we are to be obedient to our heavenly Father as he was, accepting death—even death on the cross. Through this obedience we achieve resurrected life through His sacrifice for our sake. Holy Saturday is the evening we await the glory of God, which shines in the fulfillment of Jesus' promise that one day all those who believe will rejoice forever in heaven with our God. I invite all of you to take part in these sacred days (as best you can), for this is the faith we profess and the tradition we celebrate when we come to Mass every week.

**LENTEN REGULATIONS**

Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

**Entering and Dying.** This Holy Week begins with a festive entry into Jerusalem with cloaks spread around, with leafy branches waving, and with "Hosannas" crying out. But this all ends with suffering and death.  
*How will spend this day and this week emptying myself as Jesus did? How can I, like Jesus, be more humble? How will I be obedient?*

**Baptism Information:** Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

**Marriage Information:** Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

**Parish Registration:** New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

**Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls:** Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.


