

Sunday Readings for November 8, 2020 (Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time)

Reading 1 (Wis 6:12–16)

Resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her, and found by those who seek her.

She hastens to make herself known in anticipation of their desire; whoever watches for her at dawn shall not be disappointed, for he shall find her sitting by his gate.

For taking thought of wisdom is the perfection of prudence, and whoever for her sake keeps vigil shall quickly be free from care; because she makes her own rounds, seeking those worthy of her, and graciously appears to them in the ways, and meets them with all solicitude.

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 63:2, 3–4, 5–6, 7–8)

R. (2b) My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God. O God, you are my God whom I seek; for you my flesh pines and my soul thirsts like the earth, parched, lifeless and without water.

R. My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God. Thus have I gazed toward you in the sanctuary to see your power and your glory, For your kindness is a greater good than life; my lips shall glorify you.

Reading 2 (1 Thes 4:13–18 or 4:13–14)

We do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep. Indeed, we tell you this, on the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will surely not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God, will come down from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Thus we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore, console one another with these words.

Gospel (Mt 25:1–13)

Jesus told his disciples this parable: *“The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones, when taking their lamps, brought no oil with them, but the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps. Since the bridegroom was long delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep. At midnight, there was a cry, ‘Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!’ Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise, ‘Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.’ But the wise ones replied, ‘No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves.’ While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. Afterwards the other virgins came and said, ‘Lord, Lord, open the door for us!’ But he said in reply, ‘Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.’ Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour.”*

Actions have consequences. As children, we were often told that if we would do something, then we would receive a present or a reward. If we didn't, it might result in a punishment. Geometry also uses the “If-Then Statement.” That is what our scriptures are like this Sunday. In each reading, there is a suggested action on our part, which will result in a desired outcome. There is a feminine personification of God as Wisdom, Psalm 63 and the intimate thirsting for God, the letter to the Thessalonians on believing in Christ, and Matthew's parable of the wise and foolish virgins. In the world of instant everything, we are not good about being patient, and our follow-through can be terrible. But each reading in its own way promises us that if we diligently seek God, we will be blessed and rewarded, and that it is worth the work and the wait!

Today's parable of the ten virgins gives us an opportunity to ponder the second coming of Christ and the time when we will meet the Lord of life at the end of our own lives. Its imagery also might remind us of how we began our lives as Christians with new life through the baptismal waters and by receiving the light of Christ from the paschal candle. If we were baptized as infants, our parents and godparents were told, "[T]his light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly. This child of yours has been enlightened by Christ. He is to walk always as a child of light. May he keep the flame of faith alive in his heart. When the Lord comes, may he go out to meet him with the saints in the heavenly kingdom" (Rite of Baptism for Children 100). As we grow, this responsibility to keep the flame of faith alive is transferred more and more to each of us. We are always to remember that we are children of the light and to nourish the flame received at baptism so it will be burning brightly until the last breath we take.

Maintenance Fund Collection YTD: \$1,578

Maintenance Fund: You may have noticed in your packet of offertory envelopes and in our Online Giving system that we added a new fund envelope for Maintenance Projects. We are asking for your help to finance two urgent maintenance issues in the parish: lighting in the church and parking lot repairs.

Repairing lighting in our church is a resource-intensive endeavor requiring lifts, dismantling of each hanging fixture, and subsequent reassembly. As you have seen, our lighting is failing and needs urgent attention. From an efficiency standpoint, it only makes sense to simultaneously make the switch to LED lighting, where possible, to save on energy costs, which will be a longer term solution and enable us to take advantage of any available rebates.

Our parking lot has been neglected for too long now. Cracks and potholes are appearing because of our climate, the use of salt in the winter, and the age of the parking lot. Our lot sees a lot of traffic daily from Masses, school, and Religious Education programs all using the same surfaces. Repairs and resurfacing is expensive and is beyond what we can afford from our operating budget.

We humbly ask you to reflect and pray over the amount you can help on these two projects which will enhance our facility and worship space. All homeowners know that maintenance and repairs are something we all face to keep our homes in good shape. So too it is at God's House Our Home, St. Philip the Apostle Parish. We will publish the collections and expenditures for these items in the bulletin separately to provide transparency to parishioners. Thank you for your continued support!




