Sunday Readings for November 22, 2020 (The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe)

Reading 1 (Ez 34:11–12, 15–17)

Thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will look after and tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep. I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark. I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord GOD. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly. As for you, my sheep, says the Lord GOD, I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats.

Reading 2 (1 Cor 15:20–26, 28)

Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the firstfruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death. When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all.

Gospel (Mt 25:31–46)

Jesus said to his disciples: *“When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, ‘Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.’ Then the righteous will answer him and say, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?’ And the king will say to them in reply, ‘Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.’ Then he will say to those on his left, ‘Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.’ Then they will answer and say, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?’ He will answer them, ‘Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.’ And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life.”*

Sixth grader Sophia Fricano responded to the November 15 WOG questions (What are some of the gifts you see in each other? How can you use those gifts to make a difference in the world?) with the following answer to her catechist Sal Ferenzi: *"Hi Mr. Sal, How are you doing? The gifts I see in each of my family members: My mother is a hard worker and always helps us out. My sisters are okay, they help around the house with chores. We all help out with chores. We also help out our neighbor who is old with grocery shopping. My father is a hard worker, kind, funny, and a generous man. He grows a lot of vegetables in the garden during the summer and gives it all away to family and friends. He always helps my grandparents too. I believe the gifts my family members have motivates all of us to do better. I know God is watching over our family."* Mr. Sal replied: *Thanks for asking, Sophia, we're doing fine. You are very fortunate to have a mother and father that show their love for you and your siblings through their hard work. Its great that you all help with the chores, and that you show love for your neighbor. Your father is very generous and is showing you a good example by his willingness to share his vegetables with family and friends. Caring for the elderly is rare these days; I hope that you will do the same for him, in his old age. The examples that your parents are showing you are things that you will carry throughout your life. You are all doing God's work. God Bless, Mr. Sal*

The world in which we live is complex. We are a diverse, global society and there are many issues and opinions ranging from climate change to politics to creed. Sometimes we try and sort it all out, and it is hard to know who and what to believe. One can find multiple takes on the same news story, and social media can easily sway us. Yet when we focus on the Gospel story, it seems very simple indeed. We do not have to know it all or figure it all out. We are not the one on the throne during the Last Judgment. When God starts separating the sheep from the goats, the formula is a simple rule of thumb. *"When did you see Christ in others? When did you respond accordingly?"* It does not ask if you are Catholic or even Christian; whether you had a police record or an incurable disease; whether you had a PhD or a fifth-grade education, or what languages you spoke. The call is to remember that *"Whatsoever you did to the least you did for me."* And then there will be the invitation, *"Come you who are blessed. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."*

Today we celebrate Christ the King Sunday, our final Sunday of the church year and fittingly, our gospel speaks to us of what will happen at the end of time *"when the Son of Man comes in his glory."* He will sit in judgment of the nations, and if we were wondering how we will be judged, Jesus spells it out. Those who enter into the kingdom of heaven will be the ones who fed the hungry, gave water to the thirsty, welcomed the stranger, clothed naked, cared for the ill, and visited the imprisoned. These are the nonnegotiable actions of discipleship. When we show love and care for others we are loving and caring for Christ, and when we insulate ourselves from suffering and turn away, we are rejecting Christ.





We get the start of the Corporal Works of Mercy in Matthew 25. Two more are added over time. Pope Francis adds one more. These are the behaviors by which each will be judged—actions toward others are, in fact, done for and to God. What we **think** is important. What we may **say** is also important. But what we **do** is key, is more important. Here is the list: feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty; shelter the homeless; clothe the naked; visit the sick; visit the prisoners; bury the dead; give alms to the poor; and care of our Common Home. *Who does not have enough that I will feed? 
