



Sunday Readings for September 20, 2020 (Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

Reading 1 (Is 55:6–9)

Seek the LORD while he may be found, call him while he is near.

Let the scoundrel forsake his way, and the wicked his thoughts;

let him turn to the LORD for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving.

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD.

As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts.

Reading 2 (Phil 1:20c–24, 27a)

Brothers and sisters: Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me life is Christ, and death is gain. If I go on living in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. And I do not know which I shall choose. I am caught between the two. I long to depart this life and be with Christ, for that is far better. Yet that I remain in the flesh is more necessary for your benefit.

Gospel (Mt 20:1–16a)

Jesus told his disciples this parable: *“The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o’clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, ‘You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.’ So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o’clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o’clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, ‘Why do you stand here idle all day?’ They answered, ‘Because no one has hired us.’ He said to them, ‘You too go into my vineyard.’ When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, ‘Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.’ When those who had started about five o’clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, ‘These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day’s burden and the heat.’ He said to one of them in reply, ‘My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?’ Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last.”*

Perhaps it can be a key to help us discover the secret of God’s generosity and justice. In the Lord’s Prayer, Jesus teaches us to ask only for “our daily bread.” We are not to ask for more than we need, but enough to see us through that day. We are to trust in God’s providence to provide again for what we will require tomorrow. There is a fullness and abundance in God’s mercy and care that will provide what is enough, what is satisfying, for each. AN INVITATION TO ENCOUNTER CHRIST

God is the source of all wisdom; we hear his word proclaimed, and we are spiritually nourished. We read in scripture, “Come, eat of my food, and drink of the wine I have mixed! Advance in the way of understanding.” These words are calling us to savor what God has to say. He is the source of wisdom and understanding that can bring clarity to our lives as we live by his word. In these times of uncertainty, the one and true constant is the unconditional love God has for us and his unwavering presence in our lives, even when we don’t recognize it.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RICA) is the process of bringing new members into the church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. This is a formation process for adults who have not yet received any or all of these sacraments. Our format is simple. With the aid of reading materials, discussion, service activities and, most importantly, the witnessing of Christ in the lives of the RCIA mentors, we hope to increase the candidate’s understanding of the presence of God in his/her life. We strongly encourage the participation of candidate and sponsor in these activities. The sessions will prepare the candidates for the completion of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist on Holy Saturday. If you or someone you know needs to receive these sacraments and has the desire to advance in their relationship with God, please contact me for more information.

Today’s readings provide sweet refreshment to all of us who know the bitterness of discouragement. No matter how stubbornly we determine to improve ourselves, the human condition often leaves us in puddles of failure and regret. Jesus has a new plan for us. Today’s Gospel parable demonstrates the mercy of God, mercy that rejoices in fresh beginnings. We take comfort in knowing that God accompanies us in our labors—and works for us—whether we struggle with caring for our bodies, striving for patience, avoiding gossip, making time for prayer, being generous, overcoming addiction, remaining in recovery, or simply attending to our daily work. Jesus shows us that he actively engages with us each time we fall short. From dawn to dusk, the Lord seeks us out, calling us to join him in the vineyard. Now, today, right this moment, is our dawn. Or our nine o’clock. Or noon? Ignore the clock! Jesus invites us to forget past failures; divine mercy wipes them away. Today’s psalm insists that the “Lord is near to all who call upon him.”



Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.


