

Sunday Readings for September 27, 2020 (Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

Reading 1 (Ez 18:25–28)

Thus says the LORD: You say, “*The LORD’s way is not fair!*” Hear now, house of Israel: Is it my way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair? When someone virtuous turns away from virtue to commit iniquity, and dies, it is because of the iniquity he committed that he must die. But if he turns from the wickedness he has committed, and does what is right and just, he shall preserve his life; since he has turned away from all the sins that he has committed, he shall surely live, he shall not die.

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 25:4–5, 8–9, 10, 14)

R. (6a) Remember your mercies, O Lord. Your ways, O LORD, make known to me; teach me your paths, guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior.

R. Remember your mercies, O Lord. Remember that your compassion, O LORD, and your love are from of old.

The sins of my youth and my frailties remember not; in your kindness remember me, because of your goodness, O LORD.

R. Remember your mercies, O Lord. Good and upright is the LORD; thus he shows sinners the way.

He guides the humble to justice, and teaches the humble his way.

R. Remember your mercies, O Lord.

Reading 2 (Phil 2:1–11 or 2:1–5)

Brothers and sisters: If there is any encouragement in Christ, any solace in love, any participation in the Spirit, any compassion and mercy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, with the same love, united in heart, thinking one thing. Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others. Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus, Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel (Mt 21:28–32)

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: “*What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He came to the first and said, ‘Son, go out and work in the vineyard today.’ He said in reply, ‘I will not,’ but afterwards changed his mind and went. The man came to the other son and gave the same order. He said in reply, ‘Yes, sir,’ but did not go. Which of the two did his father’s will?*” They answered, “*The first.*” Jesus said to them, “*Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him.*”

Animals never object to punishment, only humans. A wounded gerbil wouldn’t shake her fist at the skies and ask, “*Why me?*” But as Ezekiel knows, human beings complain constantly. Humans are supposed to be more logical than animals, yet we irrationally protest natural consequences that we do not like, such as pain or death. Mysteriously, our bitterness against nature is rooted in our unique capacity for greatness. Unlike every other creature in the universe, we humans are made in the image and likeness of God. We may live in the natural world, but God calls us every minute to supernatural glory. Though we are mortal, God’s mercy has destined us for immortality. Our hearts long for perfect bliss unlike anything we will ever know on earth. No wonder we demand so much from God! Preserved for glory as we are, we experience pain when earthly life falls short of our divine expectations. Jesus shows us the antidote for that pain—service. Though we share in the kingship of Christ, we must demonstrate our royalty as Jesus does, by serving others. As Saint Paul tells us, Jesus is God, yet takes the form of a slave—our slave. The Gospel encourages us to imitate Jesus in this way. We may object to being a servant at first, and even grumble about it. But God’s strength can help us overcome natural objections and enter gracefully into our supernatural role, heirs to the kingdom of God.

Today's parable about the two sons should make us all squirm a little. How many times have we found it easier to tell someone what he or she wanted to hear with no intention of following through, rather than entering into a difficult conversation? We could think of tired parents who tell their child "I'll play with you after dinner," only to have that time come and be ready with another excuse. Or children who promise to clean their room, never intending to keep their word and hoping their parents will become distracted by something else. The parable points to our relationship with God and our commitment to the life of discipleship. God has asked us to work in his vineyard, caring for the poor, working for justice, and bringing peace to others. As Christians, we are called to love God and others, not simply through the words we say but, more important, in the ways we give of ourselves for the good of all. In your life, where is God calling you to more action and fewer words?

What do we lean on in times of uncertainty? The second reading today reminds us that in the end three things remain: faith, hope, and love.

Faith is the belief in what is not seen: our faith in God to protect us and guide us to a place where we will enjoy his presence; faith in each other that we will do what it takes to keep us all healthy and wanted. Hope is the desire for the best in life—whether for us individually or our families or our community or our world. Our hope can be, and usually is, a driving force in our lives giving us purpose and conviction to continue moving forward as we face difficult times. Love is the unexplainable bond which unites us for life with a connection that is deeper than life itself. Love is everlasting and the greatest gift that we can give or receive. The love of God our Father brought us into being and gave us life. Jesus' love and ultimate sacrifice of giving up his human life draws us closer to him through the sharing of a common life and death. The Holy Spirit gives us the love that imparts courage, wisdom, piety, and all the gifts we need to be faithful followers of Christ and the same love enables us to love fully to the end of time. During times of uncertainty faith, hope, and love can become times of confidence in each other and in the belief that God never abandons us.

Sometimes we bristle at being told what to do. We may say a yes or a no, then do something else. The demands of Christian living are not easy. But we look to Jesus for guidance, for encouragement, for example. Reread Philippians all week. It is a longer version of what we heard on Palm Sunday. 

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.


