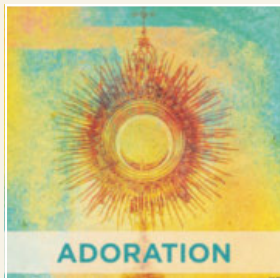

HOMEBOUND COMMUNION MINISTRY



When the new liturgical year began, our parish re-instituted the formal distribution of consecrated hosts to those Extraordinary Ministers of Communion who will be taking the Eucharist to our homebound parishioners. The commissioning prayer is said just after the congregation has received Jesus. This procedure had been in place previously at St. Philip's, and is based on church law which provides:

Clergy are the ordinary ministers of the Eucharist. Non-clergy are only permitted to distribute the Eucharist in particular circumstances. An extraordinary minister of Holy Communion (EMC) may administer Communion only when the Priest and Deacon are lacking, when the Priest is prevented by weakness or advanced age or some other genuine reason, or when the number of faithful coming to Communion is so great that the very celebration of Mass would be unduly prolonged. This is, however, to be understood in such a way that a brief prolongation, considering the circumstances and culture of the place, is not at all a sufficient reason. All ministers of Holy Communion should show the greatest reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist by their demeanor,

their attire, and the manner in which they handle the consecrated bread or wine.

It is never allowed for the extraordinary minister of Holy Communion to delegate anyone else to administer the Eucharist, as for example a parent or spouse or child of the sick person who is the communicant.

Fr. Binu and the parish staff realize that this procedure no longer permits any individual parishioner to take the Eucharist to their loved ones. This procedure is not intended to limit the opportunity for our loved ones to receive Jesus in this wonderful Sacrament, but it allows our parish to become aware of those parishioners who need to be added to our homebound ministry. Deacon Sean supervises our homebound ministry, so please contact him to advise the names of your loved ones so that visits can be appropriately scheduled. Feel free to discuss this procedure with Fr. Binu, Deacon Sean, or Deacon Phil.

Letters to the Parish

Preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation

As part of their preparations for Confirmation on February 15, 2025, the eighth-grade students from the school and the Religious Education Program wrote letters to St. Philip parishioners. The letter below is from Vincent Calabrese, an eighth-grade student at St. Philip the Apostle School. Please keep Vincent and all of our students in your prayers as they continue their preparations toward adulthood in the Church.

Dear St. Philip the Apostle Parish,

My name is Vincent Harold Calabrese, the son of David George Calabrese, third degree Knight of Columbus, and the son of Jennifer Lynn Calabrese, Eucharistic Minister for the church. My Confirmation sponsor is Greg Stopka, one of my father's best friends. He was part of the Catholic faith, but never went to church that much because of events going on in his life. After I asked him to become my sponsor, he has been going to church every single Sunday, as well as bringing non-Christian friends to church as well. This is why I chose him as my sponsor, since he did truly try to find time to go to church, and I helped him do so.

The saint that I am picking for my saint name this Confirmation is Carlo Acutis. The reason I picked him is because he is going to be one of the most recent saints. Even though he was approved by the Vatican yet not canonized yet, I was able to take him as my saint name before his canonization.

Inside of myself, I feel like I am completely ready to be confirmed inside of the sacrament of Confirmation. First off, the reason I truly want to be confirmed is because I want to grow my strength, beliefs, and faith inside of the Catholic church. Another reason why I want to be confirmed is because of what I plan to do later inside of my life for this parish. After I am confirmed, I am planning on becoming a lector for the church, since I am not yet able to become a Eucharistic Minister until I am eighteen years old. Once I am eighteen after being confirmed, however, I will join in as Eucharistic Minister. My thoughts upon this faith for the church are above many different things inside of my life, with academics inside of the school of St. Philip the Apostle being a close second. I will continue to participate inside of the church by doing two things. First, I will still be altar serving at weekend masses, and maybe weekday masses. I will not leave the church after being confirmed like others. I will continue to grow inside of this parish. Second, I will begin my journey as a lector for weekend mass. Many different members of my family have been lectors, and with my strong faith, nearly stronger than my parents, I will continue to read not only the books from the Old and New Testament, but maybe even the words of Jesus Christ himself.

All of the service experiences that I have done to help me not only aid my service hours, but also help me better prepare myself for what is yet to come. I have done many examples of these service experiences, as well as having others planned out for the future. One of these examples that have already happened is VBS, or Vacation Bible School. I was a helper for the three days of Vacation Bible School, having to watch the children inside of my group, as well as better explaining them about God. I have learned from this example of service experiences that I will need to explain complicated facts about being a Catholic to younger children, even though it is the same that everyone else learns in their lives. Another example of a service experience that I will do in the future is donating for a food drive. My parents and I have decided that we will get every person in the neighborhood to donate non-perishable foods to the Addison Food Pantry, in hopes of helping the people that have less than us. I have many more examples of service hours that I plan to perform before my Confirmation, but VBS and the food drive are the two most important.

The Feast of the Holy Family always fills me with great joy for God’s gracious gift of being graced with wonderful parents, spouse, children, and relatives. Those of us who have been so blessed should be constantly thanking God for those special favors. Unfortunately, not all of us have had the same experience, and I certainly need not detail all the difficulties, hurts, and disappointments that accompany many life situations.

Even those who have great family relationships have suffered through great pains of loss. Losing a loved one or experiencing a tragedy leaves a hole in our hearts that nothing can fill; we simply cover it over, and get on with life.

So as we consider the realities of our human condition, we naturally wonder what relevance today’s feast has for us? Mary and Joseph didn’t have it particularly easy. Mary was found pregnant without yet being married, no one took them in as Jesus birth was imminent, their government wanted to eliminate their child, their son got lost while supposedly traveling in a caravan, they had to raise this extraordinary human likely not really understanding how and when their son would change from an average boy into the Messiah, Joseph died leaving a young widow, Mary was left when Jesus departed for His three year mission, and Mary had to bear the terrible burden of seeing her son tortured and hung upon a cross.

Would any of us have wanted to change places and experience those events in our life? Yet, Mary persevered always believing that by following God’s will all would end up for the best. Mary is now called Queen of the Universe and Patroness of the Americas. Numerous shrines have been erected on sites where Mary has appeared to provide counsel and help, such as Fatima and Lourdes and as Our Lady of Guadalupe. Mary of Nazareth couldn’t have imagined those things when first confronted by Gabriel as a teenager.

What we will experience after death is unknown, but God has promised us we will be rewarded according to our merits. Simply doing the best we can each day, and trying to be a faithful, intentional disciple of Jesus is all that is required. I hope and anticipate that our heavenly life will be beyond our imagination. I recall a saying that if an acorn could think it could never anticipate becoming a massive oak. Our human life (the acorn) can never imagine what our resurrected self (the oak) will be like. Our faith makes our hope possible. The example of the Holy Family encourages us to persevere in our daily trek through life. May God give us sufficient graces to do so.

No parent was given a definitive manual on how to form a family, we all learn as we go. A sort of on the job training exercise that most of the time works out for the best. We all experience trying times as family, frustration, sadness and even a sense of inadequacy. However, we do know that our love for each other overcomes these moments and draws us back into relationship. We hear today of a parent's worst fear, and it comes from the Holy Family. Imagine not being able to find your child for days and having to search and retrace your steps to the place you last saw them. There are times when we lose someone we care about, not necessarily physically but emotionally or by a mutual stubborn attitude. The best recourse to these situations is to remember that love can help us find them and reunite us. We can love even in times of not liking what the other person doing. This is also true of our relationship with God. God's love is unconditional, he loved us before we were born and continues to love us until we are reunited with him.

In his homily given by Pope Francis on the Feast of the Holy Family, 2015 tells of the power of love's effect on the family when he said .

“From the exemplary witness of the Holy Family, each family can find precious guidance for the style and choices of life, and can draw strength and wisdom for each day's journey. Our Lady and Joseph teach us to welcome children as a gift of God, to beget them and raise them, cooperating wonderfully in the work of the Creator and giving to the world, in each child, a new smile. It is in a united family that children bring their existence to maturity, living out the meaningful and effective experience of freely given love, tenderness, reciprocal respect, mutual understanding, forgiveness and joy.”

The reflection of God's love in the Holy Family is part of God's plan for all his children.
