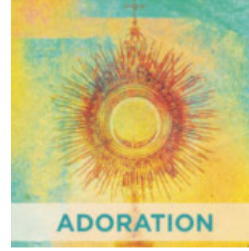
## Children's Liturgy of the Word

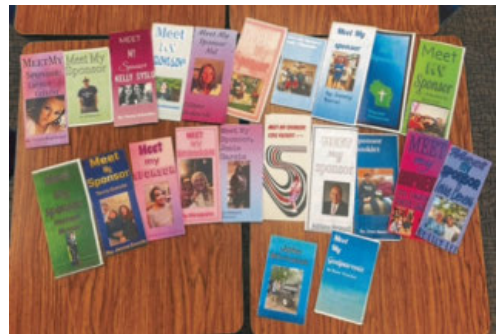
Dear St. Philip the Apostle Parish,

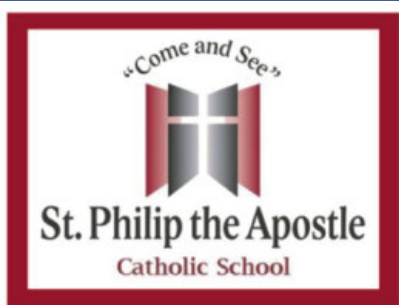

Trying to understand how we can best pray has been a conundrum for Christians since the beginning of Christianity. One of the finest explanations we have comes from a letter Saint Augustine wrote in the 300's which still exists. My next few articles will quote from that correspondence.

"Why in our fear of not praying as we should, do we turn to so many things, to find what we should pray for? Why do we not say instead, in the words of the psalm: I have asked one thing from the Lord, this is what I will seek: to dwell in the Lord's house all the days of my life... He who is true life itself taught us to pray, not in many words as though speaking longer could gain us a hearing. After all, we pray to one who, as the Lord himself tells us, knows what we need before we ask for it.

Why he should ask us to pray, when he knows what we need before we ask him, may perplex us if we do not realize that our Lord and God does not want to know what we want (for he cannot fail to know it), but wants us rather to exercise our desire through our prayers, so that we may be able to receive what he is preparing to give us. His gift is very great indeed, but our capacity is too small and limited to receive it. That is why we are told: Enlarge your desires, do not bear the yoke with unbelievers.

The deeper our faith, the stronger our hope, the greater our desire, the larger will be our capacity to receive that gift, which is very great indeed. No eye has seen it; it has no color. No ear has heard it; it has no sound. It has not entered man's heart; man's heart must enter into it.

In this faith, hope and love we pray always with unwearied desire.

However, at set times and seasons we also pray to God in words, so that by these signs we may instruct ourselves and mark the progress we have made in our desire, and spur ourselves on to deepen it. The more fervent the desire, the more worthy will be its fruit. When the Apostle tells us: *Pray without ceasing*, he means this: Desire unceasingly that life of happiness which is nothing if not eternal, and ask it of him who alone is able to give it."

There are many designations for today in the life of the church. First, we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord. It was the custom that the first born male was dedicated to God. This is what Mary and Joseph did 40 days after the child Jesus was born. In effect, his life was given to God by his parents so he may do God's will in the life of the temple. Second, today is also called Candlemas, recognition of the light of the world being present. We hear Simeon's declaration in the gospel, "for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of your people".

Jesus is the light of the world and he walked along with us to show us the way to the Father. In doing so, in being human, Jesus knows firsthand of everything that we experience. We have the opportunity to open ourselves to him for consolation and rejoicing in our lives and are assured that he understands what we are going through. Because of this special relationship with Jesus, we are able to companion others in their sorrows and joys as well.

This leads us to the third designation of today, World Day of Consecrated Life, a day of prayer and reflection of and for those who have dedicated their lives to God and His people, priest, nuns, and brothers.

As we pray and reflect on them we also pray for more vocations for the building up of the church.

Consider someone whose living a consecrated life has impacted you life, maybe a nun or brother who taught, or a priest who has helped you to grow in the love of God or may have been there in a time of need. Sometimes they are just a good friend who accepts you for who you are and loves unconditionally, following in the steps of Christ.
