



"If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts" - Responsorial Psalm 95



BENEFITS OF A PAPER CALENDAR IN THE DIGITAL AGE





IN AN ERA DOMINATED BY SMARTPHONES AND DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY, the traditional paper calendar may seem like an antiquated relic from a bygone era. In 2011, I officially switched from my five-year calendar/planner, which sat with heavy prominence on my desk, to a digital

calendar that automatically syncs with my phone. Admittedly, the digital calendar is much more convenient and efficient, and once I made the move, I had no regrets. Yet, I still miss some of the nuances of using a paper calendar.

One thing I miss about writing an event down is the ability to impress my friends or family by telling them that I'm going to write down our appointment "in ink" — a nod to the importance and value of our upcoming gathering. I also miss the act of flipping through the pages of a physical calendar, as it evokes so many memories and emotions. Esthetically, a paper calendar — especially those that hang on the wall — also provides a wide array of styles to display, like artwork, in our homes and offices.

I am delighted that the Diocese of Joliet has partnered with Catholic Extension to publish a 2024 Anniversary Calendar for our 75th Jubilee. Catholic Extension, since 1905, has been effectively building up and strengthening Catholic faith communities in the United States, especially those in economically disadvantaged or geographically isolated areas.

As we mark our 75th anniversary, this calendar beautifully expresses a narrative woven together as a tapestry of a vibrant Catholic Community. It superbly highlights key milestones with historical photographs and anecdotes that chronicle our extraordinary history and evolution. Each month unfolds with an invitation to revisit moments of significance: from the establishment of the diocese to the growth of parishes to the contributions of the clergy, religious, and laity.

This calendar also bridges different generations. It connects those who have witnessed the diocese's transformative journey with the younger Catholics who may be fascinated to learn about their roots. At the same time, it encapsulates the collective memory of our diocese, fostering a sense of community and shared heritage. Graphically, the calendar allows us to see that the diocese is much larger than only our own parish experience.


8th Grade Spotlight Preparing for Confirmation



On Saturday, January 27th, the 8th grade students from the School and the Religious Education received the Sacrament of Confirmation from Bishop Ronald A. Hicks. The students were anointed with the Holy Chrism. This seal is a consecration, representing the safeguarding by the Holy Spirit of the graces

conferred on the Christian at baptism. The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists five effects of Confirmation:

- It roots us more deeply in the divine filiation [as children of God] which makes us cry, "Abba! Father!"
- It unites us more firmly to Christ.
- It increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us.
- It renders our bond with the church more perfect.
- It gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the cross.



All of the Catechists and myself are honored to have walked this faith journey with the students. Confirmation is not a graduation from the faith but just the beginning. The students wrote letters to the parish stating that with the reception of Confirmation, they are committing to continuing on with their formation. There are three more GIFT nights for students and parents to attend. This is called the mystagogy period. This is a time after receiving the sacrament to talk about the experience and how the sacrament has affected you. I hope that you will continue to join us for these discussions.

My prayer is that you will always depend on God, develop a relationship with Jesus, continue to open your hearts and minds to knowing how much you are loved, and know that God has a plan for you! Remember, you are born for this!

Recently I was looking through the rectory's library and found some books I believe Fr. Jerry had brought with him. One, *The Evangelizing Parish*, by Fr. Patrick J. Brennan, caught my attention. I wondered if it might shed some light on our endeavor to encourage intentional discipleship here at St. Philip's. The book was written in 1987, and while reading

it, I realized the same difficult issues we are now facing were prevalent back then. Today's and next week's article will present some of his thoughts and suggestions.

When he wrote, the evangelical protestant movement was gaining strength. Fr. Brennan noted that those churches were flourishing since their members did not wait for people to come to them, but their members moved out into the world. Its lay people were empowered, enabled, and trained to evangelize, and all were expected to be actively involved in their churches rather than being mere observers. He suggests that Catholic parishes might benefit from adapting some of those skills to Catholic evangelization.

Fr. Brennan defined evangelization as the proclamation of the gospel to awaken and nourish faith. It includes any activity directed toward the building up of the Church, and the transformation of the world toward the gospel and the will of God. To encourage parishioners to become involved requires the awakening of personal faith. His parishioners may have gone to religious education classes, but never had experienced a personal conversion or heard a personal call to live the gospel.

He felt the church had created mass-produced *cultural* Catholics, but *unconverted* Christians. His plan for effective change required his parish community to learn how to live the message of Jesus in order to become a vibrant community that would attract other people who hungered for a similar conversion and lifestyle.

Although Fr. Brennan used the word evangelization, here at St. Philip's we are focusing on the phrase *forming intentional disciples*. Both ideas require attitudes of invitation and mission -- the style Jesus used with His disciples.

We may need to adjust our attitude toward God by acknowledging God as *Abba*, the word Jesus used to express His relationship with the Father. *Abba* connotes special warmth, love, and intimacy that is possible

with this loving God-parent. Maintaining Old Testament attitudes toward God is counterproductive, and improperly reflects a modern understanding of our Creator.

With an *Abba* attitude, we can help form the Kingdom of God on earth with concrete behaviors and ways of living. This change in attitude necessitates an inward looking analysis of whom we want to be, and ends with a personal conversion. Fr. Brennan concluded this is a complex phenomenon that includes decisions, changed behavior patterns, and a faith-rooted interpretation of human experience. True conversion penetrates not only private logic, but also the misguided common sense of the culture. It lifts us beyond organized religion to experience the genuine spirituality of Jesus.

We will continue with Fr. Brennan's insights next week. May God bless you and yours.

Congratulations Confirmandi!

Yesterday we celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation as our 8th grade students were "sealed with the Holy Spirit. Confirmation is the last of the sacraments of

initiation, so now these young people are fully initiated into the life of the church. When I think back to my Confirmation when I was in 3rd grade, it was a crisp autumn day. At the time, I was told that I was now a "soldier of Christ." As an 8 year old boy, I thought that it would be exciting to be a soldier and wondered when I would get my sword so I could fight the battle.

I was also told that I was now considered an adult in the eyes of the Church, again another sense of excitement, after all adults don't have to go to school. On both of these notions I was disappointed that I did not get issued a physical weapon and I had to be in school for a few more years.

Now when I consider what it means to be confirmed in the faith, I see that it means a life-long commitment to our Lord, and that the battle was against the things life presents which move us away from God. This is a serious fight; the weapons I did receive were the gifts of the Holy Spirit which are more powerful than any manmade weapons. With these gifts, each of us has everything we need to be victorious as long as we accept them wholeheartedly.

We also need to learn how to use them properly and how to develop their power inside of us to understand how to grow in faith to make a stand to what separates us from God. Through continued
