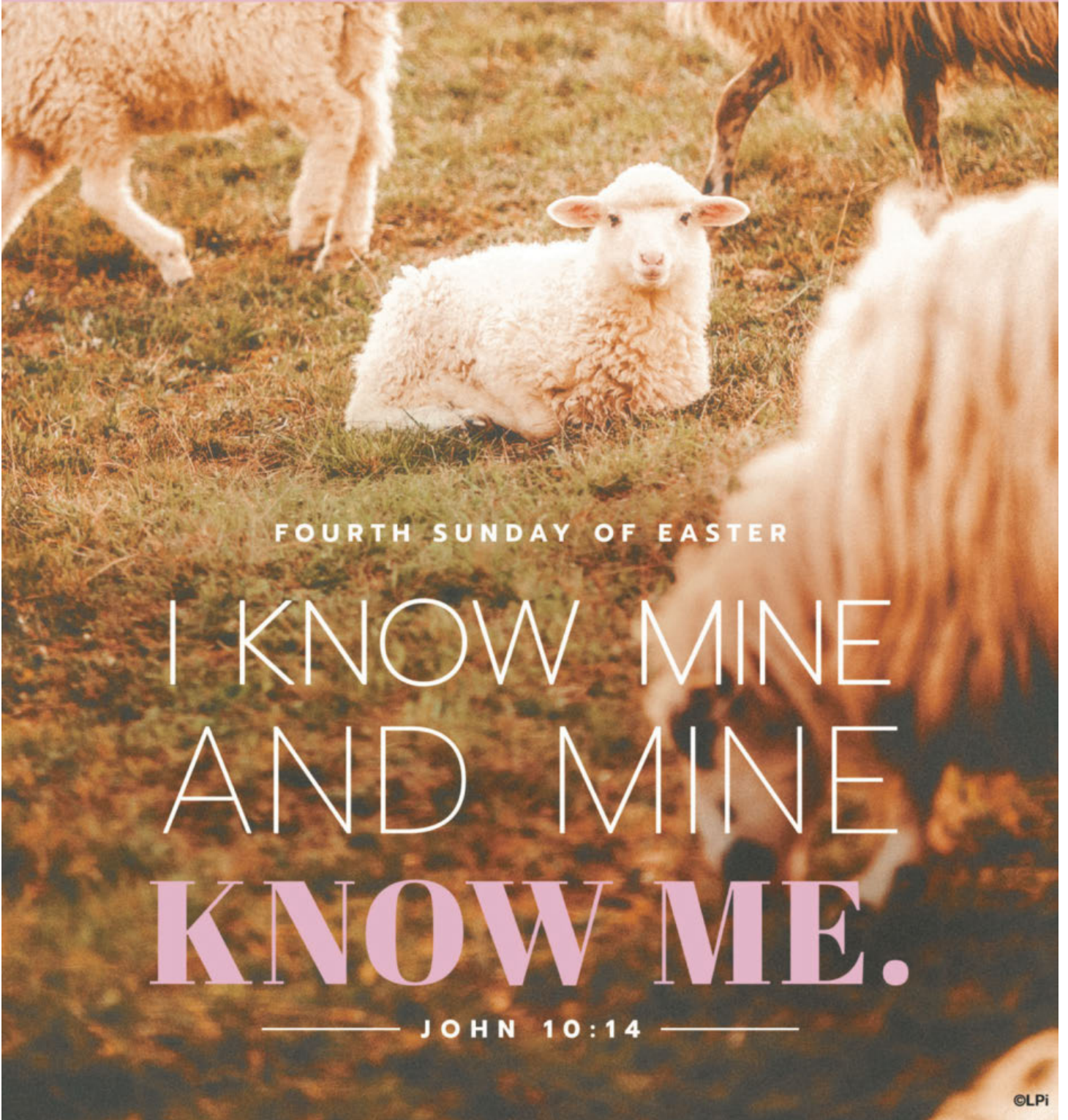

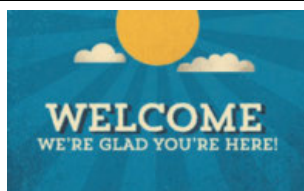

Six Ways to Be a Better Listener at Home

There once was a boss who never really listened to what any of his employees had to say. At meetings, while his staff discussed important topics, he shuffled papers or fumbled with his smartphone. He made a show of saying how much he respected his staff, but they preferred that he simply listen to them and hear what they had to say.

Everyone wants to be seen and heard, and that includes our kids. In the midst of busy family life, it can be easy to ignore the art of listening well. Here are a few suggestions:

1. **Look your children in the eye when they are talking to you.** Put down the newspaper or put aside the housework for a moment. Stop, look, and listen.
2. **Repeat without judgment what they've said.** This shows that you're listening to hear and not to defend or rebut.
3. **Hold your tongue.** If you want your children to talk to you, you need to listen. I know I always want to put my two cents in and correct or guide them. Speaking too soon can shut off communication.
4. **Ask open-ended questions (again without judgment).** Ask to learn more, not to subtly steer their thinking.
5. **Share your experience and values rather than just your advice.** When it comes time to respond, be open and tell what experience you've had with the situation at hand. Then share the values that guided your actions.
6. **Pray.** This last tip should come first. Pray for the ability to listen with an open heart and to be an instrument of grace.

Last week, we began an explanation of what “Life in the Holy Spirit” means for us, and to provide an explanation of the term “charismatic”. This article provides some details as to how the Spirit has been active in our time.

During the 20th Century, a revival of the Pentecostal experience had been considered part of the lives of many Protestants. In 1967, a Catholic professor and a graduate student attended an Episcopalian charismatic prayer group evening, and were “baptized in the Holy Spirit.” Although they knew they had already received the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation, they had experienced something extraordinary, and felt the Spirit’s presence rekindled in them.

They shared what had happened, and subsequently a group of Catholic students at Duquesne University gathered for a retreat, and they focused on praying before the Blessed Sacrament while pondering on what had occurred to the apostles at Pentecost. Unexpectedly, they experienced an overpowering outpouring of the Holy Spirit. That event became known as the Duquesne Weekend.

The participants at that retreat felt they needed to spread the message, and started to pray with others who were seeking a closer relationship with God. From that day forward a "new Pentecost" spread throughout the Catholic Church.

Many discovered a personal renewal and friendship with the Holy Spirit. Those touched gathered in prayer groups, and eventually held conferences at local, national, and international levels. Charismatic communities developed helping lay and religious to live in the graces conferred in what was referred to as “Baptism in the Holy Spirit,” not to be confused with Sacramental Baptism.

Those communities provided a place where vocations, families, ministry, and the ecumenical journey towards unity flourished.
